Dear Prestigious Democrats,

There is so much to discuss, so much movement in the Party. President Biden is waking a tightrope with the War in Ukraine. So far, he is doing a stellar job. We are

experiencing some of the backlash of the sanctions on Russian fossil fuels. Gas prices have been steady but will climb in the next 2 months as folks start their summer vacations.

As you are going to hear from Commissioner Flowers, the far-reaching Florida Legislature has gripped local politics with an unprecedented Republican grab for Commissioner Seel's seat and, they thought, a bonus of a forceful election for a well-established Democratic seat, currently held by Commissioner Flowers. The Commissioner will be running a full campaign for a seat that she should have held until 2024. Local politics are at our forefront. With that said:

We are happy to announce that **federal judge issued a ruling on SB 90** struck down 5 provisions of the Anti-Voting law that was the Governor's pet project of 2021. We are cautiously optimistic that this may stick, however, it will be appealed by the Governor.

The DWCF Convention starts on April 28th and will continue through the weekend in Orlando. You are welcome to join us. Donna, Cora, Mary, and I will be representing the Club, but we would love it if you would come and join us.

Today, let us recollect one of America's two of America's most important and surprisingly unsung environmental leaders – First Ladies Lady Bird Johnson and Michelle Obama.
