


Help us end voter suppression now by donating to the **Get Out the Vote Campaign**. Increased voter participation in the 2022 elections is critical. This campaign will target both registered voters who have not voted in recent elections and unregistered voters.

To cross barriers of mistrust, funds are needed to hire Black and Latino young adults who will door knock. Unregistered voters will be assisted with the voter registration process. They will provide, in English and Spanish, information on voting deadlines and voting options, such as how to vote by mail and early voting site locations.

## This is a follow from May's membership meeting.



I had asked you to become a Florida notary.

There are 2 reasons to do so:

- To collect Vote By Mail Ballots (VBM), an affidavit is required by LAW for each ballot.
- Following the November election, we will do a Ballot Chase. This requires us to find the folks who had gotten provisional ballots at the polling place and need to 'cure' the ballot. If this person cannot get to the

Supervisor of Elections office by 5pm, we may be able to get an affidavit to cure the ballot and correct the discrepancy.
