GUEST SPEAKER Susan A. MacManus, Ph.D.



Dr. Susan A. MacManus has served at numerous institutions and universities before retiring from the University of South Florida in 2018 as the Distinguished University Professor Emerita (political science) in the Department of Government and International Affairs, School of Interglobal Studies, University of South Florida.

She is currently the political analyst for Tampa's WFTS-TV (ABC Action News) where she breaks down the world of

Florida politics for viewers. She has earned the title of "Florida's most quoted political scientist" and has been featured in the Who's Who in America over a dozen times.

Dr. MacManus received her M.A. from the University of Michigan and Ph.D. from Florida State University. Her work has primarily focused on elections, women and minorities, and redistricting in politics, with a special interest in Florida's politics, and changing demographics.

MacManus is author of *Florida's Minority Trailblazers: The Men and Women Who Changed the Face of Florida Government* (University Press of Florida, 2017), based on MacManus's personal interviews

In addition to the weekly legislative liaison zoom meetings, I attended several "this week in Tallahassee" zoom webinars since my last report:



There has been a flurry of activity in the last days of the session. In general, many "culture war" bills have not been moving, which is good. I plan to report status of our bills of interest in my next report.

For this report, I would like to focus on Digital Democracy Project. See https://digitaldemocracyproject.org

They are partnered with an app called **Voatz** which you can download. Navigate to "Vote" on their menu. Once you download it, you input their verification key 142184 and create a PIN. This way, the real you can be voting yay or nay on bills and robots won't be skewing the results.

If you don't feel comfortable with downloading an app, you can still visit the website and navigate to the "Tally" on their menu to see results. The following shows results for the School Chaplains (HB 931) bill where purple shows that most people don't like it.



You can select other items of interest from their menu, such as bill descriptions, and scoring how well our representatives and senators are voting the way the people voting with the app want them to.

The Digital Democracy Project is relatively new. Granted, not many "voters" have signed up yet. It is intended to be non-partisan. I would like to see this project take off so that we can show the legislators how we feel about these bills.




