#### 1st Reading: Isaiah 7:10-14

The line of David is continued with the predicted birth of Ahaz's son, Hezekiah. At the time of Isaiah's prophesy, the northern kingdom and Syria were attacking Judah, and Ahaz was in deep political trouble. Assurance that David's line would continue, despite these troubles, was assuring to the people.

#### 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading: Romans 1:1-7

To be the descendent of David meant that Jesus had credibility among the Romans who had been taught by Peter and others who were, perhaps, more conscious of their Jewish roots in the spread of the new Christian faith. It also helps emphasize the human side of Jesus Christ, tying him to the world and not just to the Spirit.

#### **Gospel Reading: Matthew 1:18-24**

This reading underlines the supernatural origin of Christ's birth, unapologetically pointing to the virgin birth. Jesus came from David's line, through Mary (and legally by Joseph) and thus fulfilling the messianic prophesies. But the key is that Jesus is both God and human, setting the stage for the upcoming crucifixion and resurrection that would change the world. It is also important to note Joseph's part in all of this: defying tradition and accepting the message of the Lord.

#### \*Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor\*

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement.

If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or at <a href="www.compss.state.pa.us/cwis">www.compss.state.pa.us/cwis</a> and should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

#### **RECEIVING COMMUNION**

As Catholics, we fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when we receive Holy Communion. We are encouraged to receive Communion devoutly and frequently. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, participants should not be conscious of grave sin and normally should have fasted for one hour. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession except for a grave reason where there is no opportunity for confession. In this case, the person is to be mindful of the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition, including the intention of confessing as soon as possible (canon 916). A frequent reception of the Sacrament of Penance is encouraged for all.



## **Annual Women's Ministry Retreat**





## **The Holy Father Addresses Young People**

"Dear friends, we are not made for a life where everything is taken for granted and fixed, but for an existence that is constantly regenerated in giving, in love. And so we continually aspire to something more that no created reality can give us," he added, "we feel a great and burning thirst, so great that no drink of this world can quench it. Faced with this thirst, let us not deceive our hearts by trying to quench it with ineffective substitutes! Let us listen to it, instead! Let us make it a stool on which we can climb, so that we can look out, like children, on tiptoe, at the window of our encounter with God. We will find ourselves before Him, who awaits us, or rather, who knocks gently on the window of our soul (cf. Rev 3:20). And it is beautiful, even at 20 years of age, to open our hearts wide to Him, to allow Him to enter, and then to venture forth with Him, toward the eternal spaces of infinity."
