1st Reading: Acts 2:14, 22-33

Peter preaches not just the resurrection, but the end of separation from God. Death, in the final analysis, is the last earthly separation from God, but Christ's obedience to God's plan eliminated that separation for all humanity. We were created in God's image and the separation that disobedience causes is painful to us; Christ takes away that pain for all time.

2nd Reading: 1 Peter 1:17-21

Even knowing that Christ has died for us, has become the Passover Lamb for all time, we still continue to live this life, and it isn't always easy. Discerning God's plan for us, each one of us, makes the journey easier, but there will always be some pain. But what Peter is telling us is that we have hope, and that hope is as glorious as our faith allows it to be.

Gospel Reading: Luke 24:13-35

Jesus reveals Himself to his followers while both interpreting the scriptures and breaking the bread in sacrament. These two, of course, follow the pattern of every Mass. It is curious though that these two first generation Christians walking *unknowingly* with Jesus do not recognize Him. They tell their tales of Jesus to Jesus, yet do not recognize Him. One literal sort of interpretation suggests that Jesus was unrecognizable because he was in His glorified body and just didn't look the same. And maybe that's true. But it could be that the two followers were so caught up in the external side of Jesus- the stories and implications of those stories- that they couldn't experience Jesus within the stranger walking beside them. Jesus died for *everyone* and He is present to us *within everyone*- even a stranger walking with us on the road to Emmaus.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

Food and other products can be donated to the Trehab Food Bank by bringing them to the church and placing them in the box in the crying room next to the bathroom. Please check the expiration dates as they cannot give out expired products.

If you are shopping and see a great sale and perhaps you do not need the item for yourself, get a few extra to help out someone in the county who is not as fortunate. Perhaps you could drop a few items in the box each week. The need is ongoing.

These are some of the things they can most use: peanut butter, jelly, crackers, canned tuna, boxed macaroni and cheese, soup, pasta, sauce, beef stew, hash, canned fruit or vegetables, baby food, cereal.

They can also accept fresh fruits and vegetables but these should be brought right to Trehab on Route 29, 1½ miles south of Montrose on the left. If you garden, perhaps you could even plant a few extra items for them.

The Food Bank can also use items that cannot be bought with food stamps such as: cleaning products, bath soap, shampoo, laundry detergent, baby wipes, disposable diapers, toilet paper, trash bags, toothpaste, toothbrushes, dog and cat food.
