1st Reading: Wisdom 18:6-9

In the Book of Wisdom, the author recounts here the institution of the first Passover, prior to the Exodus from Egypt. This telling of the ancient story is renewed even today as part of the Passover celebration. Down through the millennia, this sacred bond has defined and supported God’s people through good times and bad, through joy and terrible pain. Christians associate this ‘bond’ with the promises given to the Church, and the communion of all followers throughout the ages.

2nd Reading: Hebrews 11:1-2, 8-19

Just as Abraham and those who succeeded him placed their faith in God’s promise, so do all Christians, finding in that faith purpose in a world that holds no promises. Just as Abraham was given a new, hopeful life by God, so are we Christians given new life in Christ, and hope in the world to come.

Gospel Reading: Luke 12:32-48

The sum of this passage is explicitly stated in the beginning: *‘For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be’*. Those who love and serve God are concerned with God’s ways, God’s teachings, and God’s laws; they will always be ready, because God is uppermost in all of their thoughts and actions. In Christ, we are given a model to guide our actions, and to form and shape our love. If we treasure Jesus Christ, all of life becomes the beating rhythm of His heart.

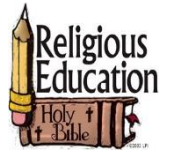
