#### **1st Reading: Isaiah 11:1-10**

This reading is so well known that it has almost become a cliché. There is, however, some remarkable imagery that stretches the imagination and emphasizes the glorious 'unnaturalness' of God's power, one that can cause carnivores to eat hay, and poisonous reptiles to allow human children to play with their young. The Christ event changes everything; the predictable course of the world is redefined and goodness prevails.

#### 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading: Romans 15:4-9

The 'encouragement of the scriptures' that Paul references here is the messianic promise that is woven throughout the Old Testament. Jew and gentile become brothers and sisters in the New Church, with differences no longer recognized. It should also be noted that the Church, in *Nostra Aetate (Vatican 2 document): Indeed, the Church believes that by His cross Christ, Our Peace, reconciled Jews and Gentiles, making both one in Himself.* 

#### Gospel Reading: Matthew 3:1-12

Christ's incarnation, as proclaimed by John the Baptist, would sweep over all of creation. From virgin birth to ascension, the miraculous would become commonplace. Paupers, lepers, criminals, and saints would find themselves in communion with one another, and kings would bow down in humility. Advent is not limited to the birth of Jesus; rather, Advent leads us to the fulfillment of God's plan. The advent of Jesus Christ's entry into human history is a time for renewal of hope, and rebirth of innocence, even in the jaded world of today. A child is born, and humanity is given the opportunity to grow up.
