1st Reading: Leviticus 19:1-2, 17-18

To love your neighbor as yourself actually has two important parts: the first is to love ('respect' might be a better word) yourself, and then to love your neighbor. This is not armchair psychology but practical advice. Folks who have very little self-respect invariably find fault with those around them. Knowing that God loves us, just the way we are, makes it very difficult to dislike others.

2nd Reading: 1 Corinthians 3:16-23

Each one of us is united to Christ, sharing in the Body of Christ. As Paul says in this passage, "Do you not know that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?" This knowledge should not be minimized or ignored or denied- it is the very meaning of our faith. Paul reminds us that human wisdom is secondary to the wisdom of God and that God's wisdom dwells within us. This 'indwelling' is a mystery that can never be fully understood by mere human wisdom, and so faith is required. Faith is needed to find the meaning of faith.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 5:38-48


This is a hard lesson. To love those who persecute us is not just difficult, but painful and demeaning. Jesus doesn't tell us to avoid our persecutors, or even to just ignore them, but to love them. How do we love those who cause us injury? It seems impossible, and it is impossible if we rely solely on our own resources. But with the Spirit dwelling within us, and with God's grace encouraging us, and with Christ teaching us with His death on the cross, it is just possible to do. And what value is there in loving your persecutors? It brings God's love into the world. It removes a little bit of hatred and replaces it with a little bit of love. It is a hard lesson to learn, but one that our Lord loves us enough to expect.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

LENTEN HOLY HOUR WITH BISHOP BAMBERA




All of the faithful in the Diocese of Scranton are invited to a Lenten Holy Hour with the Most Reverend Joseph C. Bambera, D.D., J.C.L., Bishop of Scranton, to commemorate

the diocesan phase of the National Eucharistic Revival. These gatherings will take place in each of the twelve deaneries of the Diocese of Scranton. The Lenten Holy Hour for our deanery, the Sayre Deanery, will take place on Thursday, March 9 at 7:00PM at Saints Peter and Paul Parish--106 Third Street, Towanda, PA 18848.

At their November 2021 General Assembly, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops voted to move forward with plans for a National Eucharistic Revival to renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. The multi-year Eucharistic Revival began on Sunday, June 19, 2022, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, and culminates with the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, July 17-21, 2024.
