1st Reading: 2 Kings 4:42-44

This passage is a kind of Old Testament model for today's Gospel reading. This emphasizes the notion that Jesus fulfills the earlier traditions by calling attention to the generosity and loving concern of God by repeating it 'up on the mountain' for the five thousand. Elisha, in terms of expressing God's favor, serves as the archetypal servant.

^{2nd} Reading: Ephesians 4:1-6

This is a sort of reminder: we have been baptized, sanctified, and called to be one with the Lord and each other. All of this is a given for those who believe in Jesus Christ, but not because we will it; it is a given because God wills it. So what the author here is saying is that we need to recognize what God has done with us and let Christ work through us in the world.

Gospel Reading: John 6:1-15

Jesus, by repeating the model established by Elisha (see the first reading), fulfills in himself both the servant and prophetic roles. The true miracle isn't that five thousand were fed, but that Jesus became the true bread that would feed all humankind forever; this story provides linkage between God's ancient promise and Christ's ultimate and final role. The last piece of the passage reminds us of the misunderstanding that the people have regarding Christ's purpose: it is not to be an earthly king who satisfies temporary earthly needs, but rather it is much larger and eternal in scope. Christ's purpose is not to dazzle us with Godlike miracles, but to bring us into relationship with God. Miracles come and go, but God's love is forever.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.
