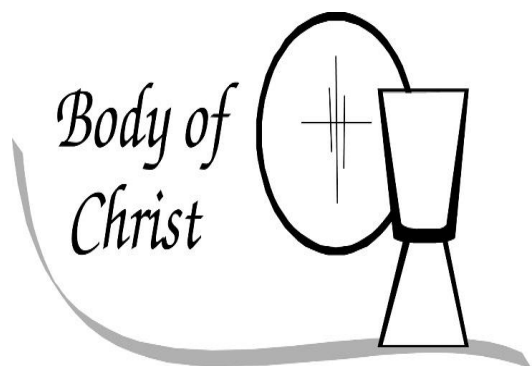

1st Reading: Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a

Manna from heaven is, in a sense, analogous to the bread of life that is Jesus Christ. God feeds the people when they can't feed themselves in the desert, and when we are far from living our lives with the spiritual bread that nourishes the soul, God feeds us with the Eucharist.

2nd Reading: 1 Corinthians 10:16-17

Paul reminds us that when we receive the body and blood of Christ we are nourished by and within Christ's body, the Church. It is true that the Eucharist brings us closer to God, but it also makes us one with our brothers and sisters in faith. The Eucharist helps to form us in the image of Jesus: *loving humanity so much that He died for us*. And then, not accidentally, forming His earthly body to carry His message to all the world.

Gospel Reading: John 6:51-58

We Catholics take this message very seriously: *“Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day”*. We believe that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist, and that the bread and wine are transformed into His body and blood. This is a hard lesson to learn in the world, but the easiest of instructions when the Spirit teaches it. When the people were fed by God in the desert, their bodies were sustained and they were grateful. How much more grateful are we who receive God's greatest gift? Those who say that there are no miracles in the present age are not paying attention.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

We ask that any adults who have been sitting in the crying room during Mass please move to the church proper in

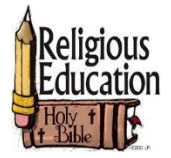
the future. We now have some new families with small children and babies who would appreciate being able to use this space. We thank you for your understanding and support in helping make our new young families feel welcomed!
