

In this passage, though not involving Wisdom in the actual creative process, the author lays the groundwork for Wisdom as a sort of personification of God. Later, this would be foundational to development of the Trinity doctrine.

2nd READING: Romans 5:1-5

The 'hope' Paul refers to here is eternal life through Christ. This 'hope' is not just a wish, but a certainty, and the assurance of this certainty comes via the Holy Spirit dwelling within. So, the peace of *God the Father* is provided to us through *Jesus Christ* and assured by the *Holy Spirit*. Sounds like the Trinity to me.

GOSPEL: John 16:12-15

Again, as in the previous reading, the apostle connects the Father with the Son and with the Holy Spirit, in relationship to each other. This Trinitarian formula creates the necessary relational qualities that resonate with the human heart, mind, and soul. We were created to find our true fulfillment in God, and God is relationship. Understanding the Trinity is as simple as giving oneself over to faith. It is important to note that when giving oneself over to faith, the Holy Spirit invests us with a sense- a mysterious, limited human sense- of being part of the relationship that defines the Trinity. That 'sense' of relationship is unchanging and revealed to us as an individual living within the community of Church. Living within Church, within the Body of Christ, though imperfectly lived out because of our mortality, gives us the Hope of the world to come. And this Hope is our soul reaching out for God.




RETROUVAILLE WEEKEND FOR COUPLES
