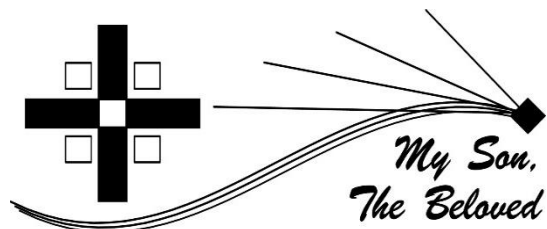

1st Reading: Genesis 12:1-4a

Abram was blessed because of his righteousness: his obedience to, and love of, God. But God, who exists both out of and within time, began through Abram His great arc of salvation that would develop within creation over the millennia, and ultimately lead to the incarnation of Jesus Christ. God’s plans are mysterious yet wondrous to behold.

2nd Reading: Timothy 1:8b-10

In this letter to Timothy, the apostle Paul reiterates the gospel message, and reminds his young friend, that God planned all of it – the birth, death and resurrection of Jesus, so that humankind would be saved. And he planned all of it before time began! Paul wrote this letter from a prison cell in Rome, shortly before his execution, and it is likely that his words were intended to comfort Timothy.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 17: 1-9

The transfiguration story, of course, prefaces symbolically the resurrection to come. It also clearly establishes, perhaps more practically, the ‘complete’ nature of Jesus before his disciples, who knew him as a man, a friend. The incident on the mountain was a theophany, and as such, established Jesus as God. There could be no doubt about who he was, and would be; their fearful (awe filled) reaction was proof that they understood. But Jesus touched them, reassured them, and then they also knew that he was still their friend. This is the real message for all of us who follow Jesus.

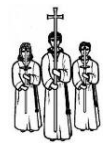

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

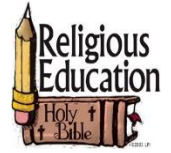

LENTEN HOLY HOUR WITH BISHOP BAMBERA



All of the faithful in the Diocese of Scranton are invited to a Lenten Holy Hour with the Most Reverend Joseph C. Bambera, D.D., J.C.L., Bishop of Scranton, to commemorate the diocesan phase of the National Eucharistic Revival. These gatherings will take place in each of the twelve deaneries of the Diocese of Scranton. **The Lenten Holy Hour for our deanery, the Sayre Deanery, will take place on Thursday, March 9 at 7:00PM at Saints Peter and Paul Parish--106 Third Street, Towanda, PA 18848.**

At their November 2021 General Assembly, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops voted to move forward with plans for a National Eucharistic Revival to renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. The multi-year Eucharistic Revival began on Sunday, June 19, 2022, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, and culminates with the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, July 17-21, 2024.

Mark your calendars and plan on joining Bishop Bambera as we pray for renewal in our devotion to Jesus Christ present to us in the Eucharist.

CHORAL SOCIETY SCHEDULES LENTEN CONCERTS



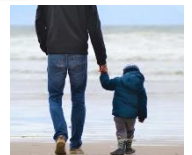
