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#### 1<sup>st</sup> Reading: Acts 2:1-11

Pentecost has been viewed as God lifting the curse of Babel by returning the capability of understanding the languages of other people. Perhaps this is symbolic of allowing God to 'filter' the confusion of a disordered world and, more importantly, of placing God 'first' in human events, before the arrogance of human achievement.

### **2<sup>nd</sup> Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13**

The Holy Spirit, as explained here by Paul, is the great equalizer. Since all comes from God, the gifts given to us have no greater purpose than to serve the Body of Christ, the Church. Human arrogance tends to rank individual capabilities according to social importance, but not so the Spirit- not so God. We are all one within the Body, and each is no more important than the other.

### Gospel Reading: John 20:19-23

The traditional understanding of this passage is that Christ was empowering the Church with the sacramental capacity to administer absolution. Some more recent thinking suggests that this passage has more to do with absolution of worldly sin through baptism, since Pentecost was the time when the early Church baptized those who were not ready at Easter. But whatever the case, Christ is clearly giving direction to the Church, launching her with the Holy Spirit. The sacraments were all initiated by and through Christ, and the Holy Spirit will always support Mother Church.

#### Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at <a href="https://www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis">www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis</a>. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

## Catechism of the Church: God's Salvation, Law & Grace

II. The Precepts of the Church

2042 The first precept ("You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest From servile labor") requires the faithful to sanctify the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord as well as the principal liturgical feasts honoring mysteries of the Lord, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the saints; in the first place, by participating in the Eucharistic celebration, in which the Christian community is gathered, and by resting from those works and activities which could impede such a sanctification of these days.
