

1st Reading: Acts 3:1-10

Peter and John encounter a lame beggar at the temple courtyard, where he asks them for money. Instead of giving him silver or gold, Peter heals the man of his disability in the name of Jesus. The man leaps about and follows Peter and John, praising God. Nearby, crowds observe this miracle. This serves as a striking demonstration of the transformative power of faith in Jesus Christ. From the miraculous healing of the lame man to Peter's bold sermon, we witness how the apostles, driven by the Holy Spirit, become instrumental in manifesting God's power.

2nd Reading: Galatians 1:11-20

This passage is the letter to the churches in Galatia emphasizing Paul's apostolic authority, Christ's self-sacrifice, and the call to live in light of the Gospel. This shows Paul's transformation from a fierce persecutor of the Church to a fervent apostle, reinforcing the transformative power of God's grace.

Gospel Reading: Jn 21:15-19

What does it mean to love someone? This is a question that has been asked throughout the ages, and it is still a mystery to us today. In this passage, Jesus asks Peter if he loves him three times. Some people believe that this was a test of Peter's love for Jesus. Others believe that Jesus was just asking Peter this question as a way of showing His love for him. This passage depicts a powerful moment of reconciliation between Jesus and Peter. Also in this passage, Jesus tells Peter to "Feed my sheep," emphasizing the importance of serving others. The verse holds a deep meaning of love, forgiveness and purpose.

SPONSORSHIP DRIVE

The annual sponsorship drive, which was established after the Harvest Moon festival was discontinued, is cancelled for this year. This drive raised an average \$25,000, so it was a very important fund raiser.

The Finance Council is proposing an alternative this year. We are asking each parishioner to determine what they are able to contribute this year. Instead of providing one large, lump sum donation, divide that donation into weekly amounts and immediately add that additional amount to your current weekly offering throughout the year.

For instance, if you previously contributed \$50 to the sponsorship drive, you would add one additional dollar each week to what you are already donating on a weekly basis. This would provide less financial pressure on our parishioners than one large contribution. There is a possibility the sponsorship drive will be re-instated in the future, if the need arises.

The rectory will be closed Friday, July 4th in observance of the holiday.



Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement.

If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (Child-Line) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compss.state.pa.us/cwis and should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.
