

1st Reading: Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15

The manna was given by God when the Israelites were desperate, when they were on the verge of starvation. It was clear to all that God provided the 'bread' since Moses and Aaron were blamed for leading them into the desert in the first place. It seems that we always turn to God when there is no other choice, when human means are lacking. We are part of creation and as such can never intentionally or otherwise disconnect ourselves from God. Receiving the bread of life is not just symbolic but, like the air we breathe, is an undeniable necessity.

^{2nd} Reading: Ephesians 4:17, 20-24

The author here calls for a commitment to the Christian way of life. The early church- particularly within those communities formed in the middle of the pagan world- was constantly caught up in decidedly non-Christian ways of living. To be reborn in the new way of Christ was not an easy thing to do, hence the strong encouragement.

Gospel Reading: John 6:24-35

Jesus interprets the truth of 'feeding the five thousand' (last week's gospel reading). The earthly bread that sustains earthly human existence, whether it comes in a seemingly miraculously way or not, is secondary to the eternal bread that is found in Jesus Christ. Understanding what Jesus was teaching was not easy, for tradition held that it was through providing 'bread' in the desert that God was known. Jesus taught that recognizing God was the first step and that knowing the bread *to be God*, in the person of the Son, was the much more critical second step. In so doing the mortal acknowledges and receives the blessing of the true eternal state of humanity created in the Image of God. The Truth of Jesus Christ is woven throughout creation and cannot be separated from it. The Bread of Life, the Eucharist, is our bridge from this mortal side to the eternal other side.
