1st Reading: Genesis 3:9-15

This reading shows how temptation, as an identifiable influence, weaves (or perhaps slinks) its way into the human story. The overarching theme is disobedience to God, but this passage seems to play out the process, that is, one in which succumbing to forbidden desire is rationalized (I did it because), blamed on others (the woman made me do it), and finally attributed to a natural impulse (the snake made me do it). But Christ shows us how to take another path.

^{2nd} Reading: 2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1

Paul here articulates the condition of humankind: we are mortal and doomed to "wither away", but through Jesus Christ, as the outer person diminishes, the glorified person flourishes within God's promise. Most of us know someone who is getting older, grayer, slower, but has a steadfast smile that just seems to speak eloquently about things to come. It's more than worldly hope that smiles at the world, it is God's blessing.

Gospel Reading: Mark 3:20-35

Jesus responds to the scribes' accusations by twisting their words back on them, undercutting their basic premise. More importantly, he warns them about disregarding his message in a larger sense. In other words, the scribes are concerned about what Jesus is doing when he casts out demons, but Jesus is telling them that they should be concerned with what God, through him, has planned for the world. Blaspheming the Holy Spirit is quite simply not listening to what Jesus has to say, and presumably not following his direction. He caps it off by pointing to his disciples as his "true family", because they listen to him; the earthly relationships, familial or not, are secondary to the message.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.
