

1st Reading: Acts 15:1-2, 22-29

Whether or not gentiles were required to follow the Mosaic Law was at issue. The conference in Jerusalem referenced here addressed the question and, presumably, a compromise was reached. There is some disagreement in other scripture passages on the details given here, but it was eventually all worked out: gentiles would not be required to follow most of the *mitzvah* (613 commandments derived from the Oral Torah). This was a major shift in the early church from tradition, hence the attention given it in Acts.

2nd Reading: Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23

This is a furtherance of John's vision of the Kingdom of God. Jerusalem, the holy city of Judah, is symbolic of the heavenly Jerusalem wherein John sees the Lamb, radiant in His rule. John suggests that the 'temple' once found in earthly Jerusalem is God and Jesus. This is foreshadowed by the Church as the temple today, and Jesus as God dwelling within.

Gospel Reading: John 14:23-29

Jesus is disclosing not only His own continuing purpose, but that of the Spirit. The apostles of Jesus would learn and grow and spread that knowledge throughout the world. The challenges that would face them, challenges that would bring martyr-dom to all but one, would be softened somewhat by the infusion of God's love through the Spirit. Believing in Jesus, and faithfully loving Him, would animate their ongoing works in the world. The indwelling Spirit would then fill them with hope for the coming Eternal Kingdom. Once again, these theological virtues- *Faith, Hope, and Love*, would transform the apostles and ultimately transform a pagan world.




RETROUVAILLE WEEKEND FOR COUPLES
