## 1<sup>st</sup> Reading: Deuteronomy 4:32-34, 39-40

On Trinity Sunday the readings emphasize the three aspects of God most commonly recognizable in each of the three Persons. In this first reading the Father is shown to be all-powerful and directing. Much as a loving human father might, God gave us the Law and in so doing showed us exactly what was expected of us. This is the iconic, mysterious God who protects and cherishes His children.

## 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading: Romans 8:14-17

In this reading God the Spirit serves as a mediator of sorts between the Son and the Father, and helps us recognize that through the Son we too are sons and daughters of the Father; we have been transformed by the sacrifice. It is worth noting that we: *did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but we received a Spirit of adoption, through whom we cry, "Abba, Father!"* To be the children of God is to be elevated, to be worthy and blessed.

## Gospel Reading: Matthew 28:16-20

In this reading Jesus sends his disciples out into the world and charges them with baptizing all of humankind in: *the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.* It was for this reason that Christ became human and it is through his humanity that we, the worthy and blessed, can recognize our true selves. Obedience to the Law occurs naturally as we love God with all of hearts, minds, and souls and as we love each other in the same way. The obedience is expressed socially as we spread the Gospel. The Trinity then is, above all else, found within the dynamics of relationship. God is love and Love seeks love.






**May 31<sup>st</sup>** – Memorial Day Mass at 9AM in the church followed by a short service at the Holy Name Cemetery.

## **WHITE ELEPHANT SALE**


**July 23-25 at the Parish Center**

## **UPDATED GUIDELINES FOR ATTENDING MASS**

*The Diocese of Scranton joyfully welcomes the faithful of the Diocese of Scranton to return to Masses at all of its parishes. Despite the challenges of the last year, we invite those who have not yet returned to Mass to rejoin us in person to celebrate the Holy Eucharist, the source and summit of the Christian life.*

- Individuals who are **fully vaccinated** from COVID-19 are not required to wear masks while attending Mass or receiving Holy Communion. Fully vaccinated individuals may continue to wear masks at Mass if desired for personal protection and/or comfort.
- **Individuals who have not been fully vaccinated must continue to wear masks while attending Mass.** Individuals who are not fully vaccinated must wear a mask while receiving Holy Communion but may briefly remove the mask in order to consume the Sacred Host.
- “Fully vaccinated” is defined as being two weeks after a second dose in a two-dose series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or two weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson’s Janssen vaccine.
- All individuals aged two or older who are not fully vaccinated, whether indoors or outdoors, must wear a properly-fitting face covering that covers their mouth and nose while attending Mass.
- Holy Name of Mary is now open at full seating capacity. Masses will continue to be at 4:00PM on Saturday and 9:00AM on Sunday.

### **Diocese of Scranton Safe Environment Coordinator**

This position will work in collaboration with Diocesan officials, and with representatives from all diocesan parishes, schools and other diocesan institutions to ensure compliance with established diocesan policies and practices, especially the *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*. Specifically, the Safe Environment Coordinator will be responsible for the ongoing development and implementation of a system to monitor State Police Criminal Record Checks, Child Abuse History Clearances, and FBI finger printing for employees and volunteers within the Diocese of Scranton. In addition, in keeping with the Diocese of Scranton's commitment to ensure safe environments for all children, this position will promote and build upon established educational and training programs for adults and children which are designed to assist in recognizing and responding effectively with the issue of child sexual abuse.
