1st Reading: 2 Kings 5:14-17

Naaman was a powerful Syrian King who learned of Elisha's healing gift from a young Jewish slave in his retinue. It is interesting that in order to receive healing from his disease, this gentile needed to humble himself and ask for help from a man whose own people were no better than servants to him. Of course, from a Christian perspective, the entire gentile world would one day find *healing of sin*, the most insidious human sickness, through the Jewish messiah.

2nd Reading: 2 Timothy 2:8-13

From a prison cell Paul (or the Pauline writer, perhaps) wants Timothy to know that even though he is dying, locked away from the world, the Gospel message continues to grow, and because of it, he is truly free. Paul, the great evangelist to the gentile world knows the power of the Word made flesh.

Gospel Reading: Luke 17:11-19

Jesus heals ten lepers, but only one returns to thank him and that one is a Samaritan, considered to be a gentile by most Jews. Again, as in the first two readings, it is the gentile who 'gets it'. Returning to thank Jesus, the Samaritan acknowledges that the healing was a free gift from God, and God expected nothing in return (consider that the nine others were also healed, and the healing was not rescinded when they offered no thanks). Worship, acknowledging that God is the source of all that we call good, brings us closer to the Light, making it easier to find our way in a darkening world. Praising God is its own reward.
