GUIDELINES FOR THE TEACHERS AND THE STUDENTS:

- 1: Familiarize yourself with the usage of MCAT vocabulary in sentences. Despite mere learning of the UHS Vocab for synonyms, the students must memorize all the possible meanings of the UHS Vocab in respect to their meaning within a given context in a sentence.
- 2: Phrasal Verbs are the most important inquiry in the MCAT Paper. Here in sentence completion general phrasal verbs (abstain from, accuse of, hit on, look forward to) have been tested, while in the next two sections of 'Spot The Error' and 'Sentence Correction' phrasal verbs from the Text Books of intermediate and MDCAT vocab make up the larger share of the paper. The students need to recapitulate all the phrasal verbs (5-10 per day) they memorized during their Part II study.

For collocation, logical selection of the right option, contrast showing set of words, and relevance showing set of words consult 'CHEMICAL GRAMMAR' the most influential book on MCAT English in Pakistan.

SECTION IV
