

Keep this leaflet handy - you might need it in an emergency

If there's a danger to life, call 999





There are things you can do to prepare for storms and flooding. Some you can do a long time ahead, others you will need to do closer to when the storm is meant to arrive.

## Prepare ahead

- Check your long-term flood risk at gov.uk/check-long-term-flood-risk call 0345 988 1188, or Typetalk 0345 602 6340
- Sign up for flood warnings at gov.uk/sign-up-for-flood-warnings or call 0345 988 1188
- Find out where your nearest sandbag store is.

## Prepare closer to the storm's arrival

- Secure loose objects outside, fastening doors and windows.
- Park vehicles in a garage or keep them away from buildings and trees.
- If eligible, join the priority services register at **thepsr.co.uk**

# If you know a flood is coming

- If it's safe to do so, turn off your gas, electricity and water.
- Move your family, vehicles, pets and important items to safety.
- If you have them, use flood protection products, like flood barriers or air brick covers.

## **During the storm**

- Stay indoors. Do not go outside to repair damage during the storm.
- Open internal doors only as needed and close them behind you.
- Do not drive unless your journey is necessary.

## **During a flood**

- If you need to leave your property because of severe flooding or damage, call the police on 999.
- If you think the flooding is from a main river or the sea visit gov.uk/ea or call 0345 988 1188.
- For public roads and highways issues visit islandroads.com or call 01983 822440.
- If mains sewage and public drains are affected visit southernwater.co.uk
- If you have a gas leak due to flooding call the National Grid on 0800 111 999.
- For power cuts or electrical faults due to flooding, call SSEN on 105
- If it's not an emergency but you're worried about a vulnerable person call Isle of Wight Council Adult Services on **01983 823340**.

#### What to do after a storm or flood

- Avoid dangerous structures such as trees or buildings.
- Look after vulnerable neighbours or relatives.
- If you've been flooded, contact your insurance company for advice about removing damaged property from your home.
- Use the council's website for local information about waste and getting rid of sandbags.



#### **Grab bags**

You should have a grab bag ready in case you need to leave your home quickly. Things to include:

- First aid kit and medication.
- Copies of important family documents in a waterproof bag.
- Cash and credit cards.
- Toiletries.
- Mobile phone and charger.
- Spare clothes and supplies for babies and children.
- A wind up or battery torch.

- A wind up or battery radio
- Spare batteries.
- Bottled water and emergency food for three days.
- House and car keys plus extra sets.
- Anything else you need to look after yourself, your family and your pets.
