

## BSYC 2024 Junior Instructor Candidate (JIC) Program

Applicants must be 15 or older within the calendar year and have 2+ years at BSYC as afternoon students or equivalent experience.

The JIC Program is designed for sailors age 15+ who are interested in working as future Sailing Instructors. This is a volunteer program that requires a minimum time commitment of 50 hours during the morning sessions of our 7-week summer sailing program.

BSYC Head Instructor will evaluate the progress of all Jr. Instructor candidates in the JIC program at the mid-point and at the end of each summer season. JICs who demonstrate proficiency as stated below, along with a strong work ethic, a commitment to setting and achieving goals and an ability to work collaboratively will receive:

- Jr. Instructor Candidate Program certificate of completion
- Letter of recommendation from the BSYC Head Instructor
- Level 1 Sailing Instructor Exam training

Jr. Instructor Candidates will receive instruction in classroom and on the water techniques that they will encounter on their US Sailing Level One Sailing Instructor exams including:

- Classroom Chalk Talk
- Land/Sea Drill and Demos (Opti/Sunfish/420/Flying Scot/Mercury)
- Student Practice (learn to run a class from the coach boat)
- Debrief
- Powerboat Anchoring, basics
- Powerboat Operation & Towing, basics
- Person-in-Water Rescue
- Land and Sea Safety Procedures, basics
- Setting a Race Course, basics
- Trailering Safety, basics
