#### FLAG RAISING IN THE TIME OF PANDEMIC



Our annual Flag Raising is one of the best traditions here at the Bay Shore Yacht Club. It marks the start of our summer season which, this year, will be very memorable. The brief (approx. 30 mins.) ceremony will be only attended by the flag officers and past commodores who are comfortable coming down to the club will be participating. The Commodore will say a few words to open our summer season and our past commodores will hoist the flags. Of course, our cannons will be fired to mark the start of another boating season. Everyone can raise a glass together at home or on the water. Yearbooks will be available after Sunday. Look for info regarding their distribution.

Let's make the start of this unusual summer one to remember!

#### FROM OUR FLEET SURGEON - DR PETER JUDGE

Please take a look at the <u>Safety Plan for Phase I</u> which I took the liberty of completing and will be posted at the club. While this form does NOT need to be formally submitted to the state, we are required to have a copy on display for all members to view. The club will make



all possible efforts to keep everyone safe and to be in compliance with all state regulations. The regulations will evolve going forward and we will update the membership with changes as they occur.

For the immediate future large gatherings at the club will not be permitted until such time as the CDC and Department of Health permit them. (Subject to the approval of the board of governors.) Members should wear masks any time that social "safe distancing" can not be maintained and are required to do so when they enter the clubhouse. We are a social club as well as a sailing club. In order to be welcoming to all - every member needs to be respectful of each other's personal space and differing assessments of safe social interactions.

We are required by the state to provide an adequate supply of PPE (masks and gloves) for our employees. We will ask all employees to wear PPE at all times. We will be implementing mandatory health screening assessment before employees begin work each day and for essential visitors, asking about (1) COVID-19 symptoms in past 14 days, (2) positive COVID-19 test in past 14 days, and/or (3) close contact with confirmed or suspected COVID-19 case in past 14 days. Assessment responses will be in a log kept at the club.

We'll need to educate staff and provide cleaning solutions (and disinfectants) for the maintenance of common areas (bathroom, all surfaces, door knobs etc.) on an ongoing basis throughout the day. You'll soon see signs posted around the club about safe practices of social distancing, wearing masks, hand washing etc. Please be mindful of your use of the facilities - especially the kitchen, bar and bathroom areas. Now more than ever, it is important to wash and wipe up after yourself, your family and your guests.

You may not be aware, but members of our Yacht Club have tested positive of the Covid-19 virus; others have lost family members to the disease. It is important that members take the same health inventory that we are asking our staff to take. If you have tested positive, or have been in close contact with someone who has Covid-19 please let us know by contacting either Matt or myself. Obviously, if you're sick or not feeling well, stay home! Give us the opportunity for contact tracing should any of our members or employees become infected with the virus by keeping track of your visits - including your guests.

By now I feel that by this point everyone knows what they should or should not do to decrease further propagation of the current pandemic. That is the easy past. We can post signage, provide soap and water, hand sanitizer and even try to regulate people's behavior with a long list of detailed rules. At the end of the day it comes down to motivation. If people are motivated they are more likely to be compliant with the basic tenants of "social distancing", hand washing etc. People need to demonstrate mutual respect and we need to lead by example. We can not always regulate stupidity, but we can set good examples and encourage proper behavior. At the end of the day however people need to be responsible for their own actions and consequences thereof. This virus requires us to take prudent action to protect our community. But, if we take proper precautions we can still enjoy some of the many benefits of being a member of the Bay Shore Yacht Club.

## PRACTICAL CONSIDERATIONS:

To increase the odds that the virus will not be passed to or from you - do what these guys are doing and wear a mask.

This is especially important if you or someone you care about is elderly and/or has underlying health issues. Fortunately, being outdoors greatly reduces the odds of transmission, but do not assume it reduces the rate to 0%. Each member of our club makes a different calculation about the level of risk they are willing to assume. Sometimes it is impractical to be "covid compliant" - But is something to always

be aware of when down at the club. Social distancing measures, albeit restrictive and cumbersome, are put in place with the intent of keeping the membership safe. Being compliant with CDC regulations regarding the pandemic is a demonstration of respect and consideration for fellow members of the club and is consistent with the mission statement of our club.



## **HOUSE & GROUNDS:**



Thanks to Barbara & Charlie Becker, the Club now has a Davis Weather Instrument, located near the end of the bar by the bell. This instrument will measure:

- **Temperature:** Present inside & outside, highs and lows for both locations.
- **Wind:** Present speed, direction & highest gust.
- Wind chill: Present & lowest recorded.

The date and time are also indicated for each of the above events. In general, highs and lows are displayed by pressing RECL (RECALL) once or twice. The high or low appears in the display along with the word HIGH or LOW and the words which normally accompany the function (e.g., OUTSIDE and TEMPERATURE for outside temperature) To see what time a high or low was recorded, wait a few seconds after pressing RECL. The time the high or low occurred will appear. Wait a few more seconds and the date will appear.



A few days after the installation of this instrument (in April), the weather service was predicting near hurricane force winds for Long Island. Our instrument measured a gust at <u>60 MPH!</u> As a comparison, at my house just south of Montauk Highway I recorded the highest gust at 32 MPH on the same type of instrument.

Sailing can be a sport that lends itself to these days of maintaining distance. As you can see from the illustration above - most sailors prefer to keep their distance from one another (Preferably behind or to leeward;)

If you are new to the club or sailing - beginning Tuesday, June 30th (fingers crossed) and every Tuesday night thereafter a sunset sail/pursuit race takes place just east of the Brightwaters canal at Bouy #1. The club also has a fleet of sunfish which are normally single-handed boats. Commodore Matt Rainis would like to try and build on the enthusiastic response to last September's Sunfish sailing event by having several of mini-regattas for members over the course of the summer. These events are not just for experienced skippers. If you can sail a Sunfish (even barely – names withheld to avoid embarrassment), you can have fun participating. As with everything these days - dates are TBD.



The good news is that thanks to <u>former</u> Boat Maintenance chair, Larry Becker - the boats were put away last fall in great shape. The other good news is we have 6 Sunfish and 7 Optis which are single handed (or 2 person = sunfish) boats with which to use for our Junior sailing program — (in addition to the Mercuries, 420s, Flying Scot and powerboats.) **But without a boat maintenance chair and people to help keep the boats sailing worthy we will have significant problems this summer with or without the issues with Social Distancing and Covid-19!** 

**WE NEED SOMEONE TO VOLUNTEER FOR THIS CRITICAL POSITION.** Larry has offered to provide guidance but can not continue to be responsible for maintaining the fleet. We are beyond the point where we need to start unwrapping the boats for the summer and doing the work needed to have them ready. Fortunately, both the sunfish and opti are relatively simple boats in terms of their level of rigging and maintenance complexity so this summer is a perfect time to learn the ropes of this position.

A sailor's work is never done....This is a position (and committee) whose commitment is ongoing during the summer as the boats are used and abused by our junior sailors. If you have no experience - no problem - there are boats that require nothing more than a little elbow grease. 
