Purpose of Assemblies:

Focus of Assemblies:

At this moment in time, an Assembly is a group of people coming together to focus SOLELY on the needs of their community. The size of the group does not matter, as long as the group is focused on the needs of their community.

NOTE: Ratification of Assemblies does NOT work at this time, therefore ratifications will not happen until a few years from now. Over the next year or two the focus must be on the needs of the community and supply chain replacements.

Priority for Assemblies:

The priority for assemblies at this time is Needs Assessments, Needs Assessments, Needs Assessments!

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Requirements for Assemblies:

A group of people coming together to assess the needs of their community and the supply chain issues that impact those needs. Period.



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FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ)

- Q.** What direction does Kimberly want to take the Assembly process?
- A.** *“I will repeat. Erase everything you think you know about an Assembly. Everything. Did I say everything, yes I said everything. At this moment in time consider yourselves a group of people getting together to focus **only on the needs of your community period. By needs I mean, food, shelter, water, healthcare, and every item used in a household as these things have all been provided to you by the global government and that is going away, their corporations are going away, and the people will need alternatives for everything.**” – Kimberly Ann Goguen, July 26, 2022*
- Q.** How many people does it take to start an Assembly?
- A.** *“A group of people, doesn’t matter the size. It can be one person at this point, if you are focused on the needs of the community then it doesn’t matter. By the time we get to ratifications a few years from now, you will have made progress to the point people will be flocking to be a part of it.” – Kimberly Ann Goguen, July 26, 2022*
- Q.** Should states that formed Assemblies retain that structure?
- A.** *“If it is working for you as a group then sure, it is not relevant to me because all I will see from you are projects and programs that need to be addressed. Remember, as I have said I am only looking for Needs Assessments and supply chain issues which are rapidly approaching. If you don’t look at supply chain issues things are going to get bad very quickly.” – Kimberly Ann Goguen, July 26, 2022*
- Q.** Do any of the PGSD structures or guidelines have a place going forward?
- A.** *“No. It was only meant to help you, and it did the opposite. It is dissolved and will remain forever so.” – Kimberly Ann Goguen, July 26, 2022*
- Q.** What works?
- A.** *“Think tanks? Understanding Needs Assessment and food security being a local and national priority.” – Kimberly Ann Goguen, July 26, 2022*

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- Q.** How many State Assemblies will be ratified per state?
- A.** *“None, I have said this repeatedly for the last year, it doesn’t work. For the next year or two you need to focus only on needs and supply chain replacements as a group. Please hear me, as I have said it several times for the last year.” – Kimberly Ann Goguen, July 26, 2022*
- Q.** Will Private Member Associations (PMAs) be the platform moving forward for Assemblies or businesses/projects?
- A.** No. They serve no purpose.
