STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

1. The student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session (first day of classes), or the seventh day after enrollment (seven days from the date when the enrollment agreement was signed), whichever is later. JASH shall refund 100 percent of the amount paid for institutional charges, less a reasonable deposit or application fee not to exceed two hundred fifty dollars (\$250), if notice of cancellation is made through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later.
2. After the cancellation period ends, you also have the right to stop school at any time and receive a refund for the portion of the course not taken. Your refund rights are described in the enrollment agreement. If you have lost your contract, ask the school for a description of the refund policy.
3. The Notice of Cancellation shall be in writing and submitted directly to the School Director. If sent by mail, it is effective upon deposit and proper postage. A withdrawal may be initiated by the student's written notice or by the institution due to the student's academic or conduct, including, but not necessarily limited to, a student's lack of attendance. After the cancellation period ends, you also have the right to stop school at any time and to receive a refund for the portion of the course not taken. REFUND POLICY—WITHDRAWAL PRIOR TO COURSE COMPLETION

INSTITUTIONAL REFUND POLICY

After the cancellation period, the institution will provide a pro- rata refund of ALL funds paid for tuition charges to students who have completed 60 percent or less of the period of attendance. Once more than 60 percent of the enrollment period for the entire course has elapsed (including absences), no refund will be issued to the student.
