Ghost is a certified Therapy Dog, so he spent lots of time at the Viking Con giving his love to people of all ages.



Search and Rescue Buhund

Congratulations to Kim Card and King on their Search and Rescue certification! As of September 2021, King is only the second Buhund in the US certified in Human Remains Detection (HRD) for Search and Rescue. He is Kim's third HRD dog and Kim is an evaluator for the National Association of Search and Rescue (NASAR).

Q: How did you decide on a Norwegian Buhund for SAR work?

Kim: I absolutely fell in love with his sire at a dog show where I met his breeder, Richard Valentini and the litter for the first time. I decided I wanted to evaluate King for working potential after first meeting him as he was climbing to the top of his exercise pen and hanging over the edge, no fear at all! We met up a week later and King passed my evaluation with flying colors. He matured into a wonderful, high-drive working dog, just as that evaluation at 11 weeks old predicted! Aside from his working aptitude, I really like his friendly/outgoing temperament and relatively compact size (compared to my Bloodhound or Field Labs); if he is ever injured on duty, he will actually fit in my backpack so I could easily carry him out. Sometimes folks underestimate King a bit upon first meeting him—he is rather cute with his permanent smile—but he really clears ground and proves himself every time. King is also exceptional in how quickly and young he was able to certify for search work. He's my third cadaver dog and certified at just under 2 years of age!

Q: How did you decide King would specialize in Human Remains Detection (HRD)?

Kim: the fact that he was carrying a jar of teeth around when I did his puppy evaluation may have been a clue! Seriously though, there are a few factors that make him perfect for HRD. His small size means that as a handler I have a harder time following him on a track via leash tension, so it is better when he works on air-scenting, for which he has a special talent. His smaller size (compared to more common SAR breeds) also puts him at risk during wildlife encounters, so he would not be an ideal dog for large area searches where he could end up facing a bear or coyote on his own. He is also a complete natural for cadaver work—took to it like second nature. He never flinches—terrain, cop cars, bad weather, mud, water, you name it and King just keeps working.

Q: What advice do you have for others who may be interested in pursuing search and rescue work?

Kim: start by looking for local SAR groups/teams with a canine unit. Many states have a SAR council, which would be the best place to start. Keep in mind that you really want to do this work yourself—with or without a dog. You have to be trained before you ever start a dog, so that you're ready to face all kinds of conditions and become an effective member of your SAR team. Search and rescue is very important volunteer work and dog-handler teams are valuable assets to the first responders in charge of rescue efforts; this is not a weekend hobby or a competitive venue. When you're ready to start training with your dog, be sure to check out a few different groups—shadow, volunteer, test the waters to be sure the training methods and other factors are right for your dog. ROM/ROMX Program

The purpose of the Registry of Merit (ROM) program is to honor the producing achievements of sires and dams that have produced a specific number of American Champion Offspring. By Awarding a ROM title to deserving producers, it gives the club a permanent record of Buhund history and will serve as a learning tool in pedigree study and research. The ROM (Registry of Merit) or the ROMX (Registry of Merit Excellent) title will be conferred upon Norwegian Buhunds that have produced the designated number of Champion progeny.

- As of 2013, an initial list of top producing sires and dams will be grandfathered into the Registry of Merit program. Owners of grandfathered ROM/ROMX sires and dams may request a printable email certificate for their records if they so wish.
- After 2013 the Registry of Merit Program will be available ONLY to Norwegian Buhunds with all Certifications completed.

ROM Requirements

- Dogs' progeny must accumulate 80 points: Must have 8 offspring with conformation, companion or performance titles, 6 of which must be AKC champion titles
- Bitches' progeny must accumulate 60 points: Must have 6 offspring with conformation, companion or performance titles, 4 of which must be AKC champion titles

ROMX Requirements

- Dogs' progeny must accumulate 160 points: Must have 16 offspring with conformation, companion or performance titles, 12 of which must be AKC champion titles
- Bitches' progeny must accumulate 100 points: Must have 10 offspring with conformation, companion or performance titles: 6 of which must be AKC champion titles
- Champions may be conformation, companion or performance. Companion or performance titles refer to: All AKC recognized titles including Agility, Obedience, Tracking, Rally, Herding, Scent Work etc., excluding CGC, Trick Dog, Farm Dog Certification, Herding Instinct, Therapy dog, Temperament Test, Coursing Ability, Fast Cat or other instinct tests.

ROM/ROMX Points Schedule

<u>Conformation</u> <u>Rally</u>

10 points: CH 10 points: RACH, RNC

5 points: GCH(any level) 5 points: all Advanced or higher level titles, including

preferred or any optional equivalents

<u>Agility</u> <u>Tracking</u>

10 points: AGCH, PACH, MACH, FTC1, FTCP1, ANC, PANC 10 points: CT

5 points: all Advanced or higher level titles (including 5 points: TD, TDU, TDX, VST

preferred), or optional equivalent

HerdingScent Work10 points: HC10 points: S

0 points: HC 10 points: SWD (detective level or higher titles)

5 points: HS and all higher level tiles, including optional 5 points: all Advanced or higher level titles, including

equivalents optional equivalents

10 points: OTCH, NOC, POC

5 points: CD or higher level titles, including preferred or any

optional equivalents

Obedience

- Tabulation is based solely upon the number of American Champions produced by a dog or bitch. Offspring sired after the death of the stud dog or through the use of frozen semen will be counted towards the calculation of the ROM.
- All statistics are taken from the published findings of the American Kennel Club, as obtained in a printed Progeny Report.
- The submitter of the dog and bitch must be a member in good standing of the NBCA.
- Dogs achieving ROM or ROMX status will be recognized in pedigrees by using the acronym, ROM or ROMX.
- The burden of proof shall fall on the owner of the dog or bitch and requires a Progeny Report from the American Kennel Club.
- In order to qualify for the ROM or ROMX a Norwegian Buhund member must fill out a special ROM or ROMX application indicating all pertinent information.
- A yearly updated list of ROM and ROMX recipients will be printed in the Buhund newsletter and will be listed on the clubs website permanently.
- All updated to the ROM/ROMX statistics require Progeny Report and is the responsibility of the dog's owner.

Registry of Merit (ROM) Application
