Park Updates

Memorial Christmas Tree

A 7ft live tree will be displayed inside the Berkshire Township Community Pavilion starting the Wednesday before Thanksgiving. We invite residents to visit and add white ribbons with the names of loved ones you wish to remember and honor. (Supplies provided)

Pavilion to remain open

As the rental season closed at the end of October, the pavilion's west side garage doors were closed to cut the wind and rain during colder weather. We will close the east side doors just after new years but the space remains accessible through all regular man doors. Our rental season will start back up May 1st and run through October 30th. We accept hall and pavilion rental applications (available on our website) 6 months in advance so please plan accordingly.



Economic Developement

The Ashford of Berkshire a senior residential care facility has recently begun building. This 8.4-acre property at the Northeast corner of S. Wilson Road and District Crossing will have 108 total units with 82 being assisted living and 26 for memory care. Residence will have amenities such as meal service daily, nursing car, multipurpose rooms, salon and fitness/rehab facilities.





Berkshire Lofts is in full build mode on the west side of Rider Road just south of the Farrow Harley Davidson access drive. This is a 4.65-acre multifamily property with 58-units ranging from one to three bedroom. The facility will offer full-time onsite management, a community room, fitness center, playground and picnic shelter.

Occupancy is expected in Spring of 2026

The Honey Grove a Del Webb Community which is a Pulte Homes project crossing two townships will ultimately have 624 homes mostly in Kingston. Honey Groves phase one will have 54 single family lots with 30 residing in Berkshire and the other 24 lying in Kingston. Crews have begun to move dirt and start infrastructure including the entrance margue. Base home plans range from 2,722 - 3,539 square feet with options to increase. Multi-use paths will be constructed connect Honey Grove to Goldwell and another will serve as a Northstar community amenity.

Home sales can be expected to start in Spring 2026.

Berkshire Retail Plaza is new on the horizon, most likely breaking ground early spring; and will sit on property located on the north side of State Route 36/37 between the existing Waffle House and Taco Bell restaurants. This property is zoned Planned Commercial and Office with a Planed Mixed Use District overlay. The property was formerly occupied by a service station which closed and has remained vacant for more than two decades. The new plaza's plans includes space for up to four retail store fronts depending on renters needs, at least one with a drive through option on one end.

Community News

What is a CEDA?

On Monday November 10th an open public meeting was held to introduce a potential CEDA

between Berkshire Township and the Village of Galena. A Cooperative Economic Development Agreement (CEDA) is a legal agreement in Ohio that lets local governments like villages and townships work together on economic development projects. It helps communities work cooperatively on infrastructure, tax incentives, and revenue to attract businesses and create jobs, while guarding against annexation. Berkshire Township and the Village of Galena see value in partnership through a CEDA. The CEDA helps Berkshire Township protect its borders by securing the ability for residents to tap into the Village of Galena's sewer district and lowers the risk of potential annexation by entering into a nonannexation agreement with the Village. The CEDA allows the Village of Galena to diversify its revenue to improve its infrastructure.

The meeting on the 10th allowed for the public to get an overview and address questions and concerns. The full agreement can be viewed on our website along with a newly posted FAQ document. Follow up questions and comments are welcomed. The Township will continue to discuss the CEDA at each of its board meetings until a vote is held (a vote is not currently scheduled). Did someone say Community Center?

On November 12th, Pizzuti Developers hosted a public open house on behalf of the Eastern Delaware County Joint Recreational District which is comprised of two representatives each from Berkshire Township, Village of Galena and the City of Sunbury. A Joint Recreational District or JRD is a partnership formed by two or more local government entities to create, operate and maintain parks, recreation facilities and programs for their shared communities. The open house was to allow the residents of each of the three communities, the opportunity to come together, discuss and give input on a potential Community Center. Over 100 people attended the event across all three communities. While most in attendance were very positive and in favor of moving forward with a potential center, there was concern over keeping any increase in taxes to fund the center as low as possible. Find more details on our website and take the survey to give your input.

The next steps for the JRD will be to take the feedback and understand wants, start to consider possible locations sites and to get preliminary cost projects. Two follow up public open houses are targeted for January and March

The first "National Christmas Tree" lighting ceremony occurred on Christmas Eve 1923 under President Calvin Coolidge. The cut Christmas tree tradition continued through 1978 when a blue spruce was planted and has served as the National Tree since. The National Tree will be lit on Thursday, December 4th. The ceremony will be broadcast on CBS at 8 p.m. ET

today's local fire departments. When Thomas Edison introduced electric lights in the late 1800s, it revolutionized holiday decorating and made the season brighter and a lot safer. Today, we have endless ways to illuminate our homes—from energy-saving LEDs to programmable displays that dance to music. But even modern technology comes with a few safety reminders:

- •Use outdoor-rated lights and cords for exterior displays.
- •Check for frayed wires or loose bulbs before hanging anything.
- •Avoid overloading outlets—spread strands across circuits.
- •Set timers or smart plugs to turn lights off overnight or when you're away.
- Secure cords to prevent trips or falls.

As our township lights up for the holidays, we carry forward a tradition that has always been about more than decoration—it's about bringing light, joy, and connection to those around us. May your holidays be *bright—and safe*.
