Greetings!

We're pleased that many of you had the opportunity to visit the Park Levy Open Houses at the township hall in September and October, and the OinkaDoodle Boo event on the 19th.

Just a reminder, Election Day is Tuesday November 5th. In addition to the candidates on the ballot, Berkshire residents will have several issues to decide.

As was mentioned last month, we now have a contract, contingent on the park levies passing, to purchase 56+/- acres surrounding our current property on Rome Corners Road. The passing of the levy and bond issues on Nov. 5 would enable us to begin the creation of a centrally located community park in Berkshire Township.

These are the reasons the trustees voted to put these issues to vote at this time:

- No more land is being "made"
- Developers are buying existing land at a rapid rate
- If the township does not move forward now, our opportunities become fewer and fewer
- Bond rates are low at this time
- The trustees wanted to leave the decision to the voters

Not yet...but soon!

As this is being written, there is a freeze warning out for tonight. No snow YET, but it will come all too soon. Here are a few tips from our maintenance department to keep us all safer on the roads this winter. Our township maintains over 20 miles of roads - if you count each direction - that's 40 miles. Priority when plowing is main roads first, subdivisions and secondary roads next. If the snow is falling very quickly, they sometimes have to start their route again, immediately after completing a first pass.

- Snowplows may travel slowly, but try not to pass them. It makes their job harder and is more dangerous for you both
- When a snowplow is approaching from the opposite direction on an undivided road, move as far to the right of your lane as safely possible
- Do not follow too closely. Snowplows need to back up frequently and may not be able to see you if you are too close
- Before you start out, be sure your windows and windshields are all cleared of snow and ice, and DON'T FORGET YOUR HEADLIGHTS. TAILLIGHTS AND TURN SIGNALS
- Slow down. Whether you have a 4WD vehicle or not, ice is ice, and speeding in hazardous winter conditions is dangerous for you and others on the road

TRASH AND RECYCLING INFORMATION

Thursday is the service day for the township. Trash will be picked up weekly and recycling will be picked up every other week, with the exception of scheduled holidays when any pick-ups will be Friday. THE MAILER YOU RECEIVED FROM RUMPKE HAS YOUR RECYCLING and HOLIDAY CALENDAR ON IT, or you can contact Rumpke at the email above with questions.

A friendly reminder on trash cart placement: The wheels on the trash cart should be towards your house, with the small silver-colored handle on the front of the cart and the lid opening facing the street. This allows the drivers to collect the carts in a more automated, time-saving, safe way. Thanks for your help on this small detail.

We encourage you to always collect your empty trash cans after pick-up as high winds may cause them to blow into the road, creating a traffic hazard. (It keeps our streets and neighborhoods looking

nicer, too.)

For residents who may not be familiar with the decision, the choice to contract with one hauler was made for several reasons, but the two main ones were:1) Economics (it saved the majority of residents quite a bit on their monthly bill and provided recycling) and 2) Safety/Maintenance (it greatly reduced the number of heavy trucks on our roads daily, making it safer for our kids and reducing wear and tear on our roads.)
