Parks Project Update

At the September Trustee Meeting, Fred Grunewald represented the Berkshire Township Parks Committee and gave a briefing of what has been accomplished. The group has been busy exploring grants, meeting with suppliers, and planning their input for the future Berkshire Township parks complex. The plan includes a large pavilion, restrooms, tennis/pickleball courts and basketball courts, updating of the walking path and gardens. Stay tuned for more details.



The Berkshire Township Parks Committee comprised of 6 township residents, and headed by Trustee Paul Disantis, has been meeting monthly since being appointed in June.

Trustee Disantis has been keeping the board informed of progress at the Township Trustee Meetings which are open to the public.

Dustin Road / Rome Corners Road Intersection

Rome Corners Road traffic does not stop at the Dustin Road intersection, but those on Dustin Road are required to stop. There have been stop signs and warnings to this effect for years, but still a number of accidents due to drivers not paying attention and pulling out into oncoming traffic.

Residents have been pushing for a 4-way stop, but the problem isn't that easily solved. Berkshire Township has road responsibility for Dustin Road, but Rome Corners is under Delaware County jurisdiction. There have been past studies which did not support a 4-way stop and a most recent Delaware County Engineer's Office report confirms that is still true. Much to the chagrin of neighbors and Trustee Rod Myers, who has been very vocal on the matter, they have rejected the request to make this intersection a 4-way stop.


Delaware County, however; did agree to make adjustments and allow more signage to the Dustin Road intersection approach including, added reflective strips, additional "Cross Traffic Does Not Stop" signs and new stop bars. The intersection is slatted for a roundabout but not for a few years, let hope the additional signs can help prevent major accidents until then.



Township Hall adds security

Berkshire Cemetery

The township maintains the Berkshire Cemetery which is located across from Bent Tree Golf Course on Rt 36/37. This includes everything from grounds keeping to the actual burials and all paperwork associated. Currently there are just over 940 recorded grave sites.

now has become a welcome hub. Shaped in the formation of a cross is a new concrete pad which allows for better footing and easier water access. You will now find the rules board which has been repaired and relocated to this area, and a new map case with detailed map of the cemetery showing loved ones as well as sold and available graves. There are also location maps available to take to help better find grave locations. Finally, there has been some new landscaping finishing off the area.


Berkshire Township Roads/Maintenance

The Road Department consists of three hardworking, full time employees Scott Hoffman - Supervisor, Dan Hale and Connor Woodford (pictured right)

The Road Department is responsible for over 20 miles of roadway, including road signage, litter control, ditch maintenance, potholing, berming, snow and ice control as well as maintenance and burials at the Berkshire Cemetery, grounds and building maintenance of all Township properties.

As mentioned in the above article the team has been busy with the Berkshire Township Cemetery improvements but in addition, current projects include prepping the new wild flower area for fall seeding. This process involves a number of steps including mowing, killing off old grass, raking and tilling. The seeding will be complete in October. Next Spring we should see the new area fill in with native Ohio grasses and wildflowers.

The crew has also been topping the current walking path with a new layer of paving materials and gravel. (top photo) This should help drainage and improve areas that were previously uneven and became very wet with heavy rains.
