Breaking Ground

On Monday July 8th there was a small ground breaking ceremony for a very big project. The Berkshire Township Parks Committee along with Trustees Mike Dattilo, Paul Disantis, and Rod Myers ceremonially put the first shovels in dirt where the new playground and pavilion will sit. The actual construction began the following week and is expected to be complete by late Fall. Original plans began over two years ago. As planning progressed, it became clear a project this size needed community input and in June of 2023 trustees approved the the formation of a parks committee lead by Trustee Disantis. The six member team has reviewed ideas, worked with vendors and put forth their recommendations early this year.

Original plans also included basketball, pickleball and tennis courts which has to be put on hold due to drainage issue that need further collaboration with Delaware County but are still planned for a future date.

Perimeter Path now Paved - Come Get F.I.T.

The long awaited perimeter path paving occurred the week of July 15th. The path runs from the parking lot south across the field and loops the perimeter of the facility. Following the new path, the loop is approximately 8/10th of a mile beginning at the parking lot, looping once and taking path back to start. Additionally, we have added a QR F.I.T. workout program along the path. QR F.I.T is a contactless, equipment-free bodyweight exercise system with 5 stations offering free exercise videos with custom options for upper & lower body, core and flexibility. The system has a vast 300+ library of fitness videos so you can vary your workouts. Bring your phone to scan in and give it a try.

The Wildflower path has been displaying a variety of beautiful flowers since Memorial Day. The original dominate purple has recently been replaced with Yellow highlights. As this is the first season it is exciting to see a good variety of flowers. A good estimate of when a field will show its full potential is at around the three year mark. It will be fun to watch what the next pallet of blooms brings. You will notice that our construction project has unfortunately had to mow a good size section. The area not being built on should bounce back in the Spring. We will be reworking, where needed, the path around the new pavilion and playground once the project is complete. For now be be aware that part of this original path is cut off by construction and we may need to post signs for complete closures depending on what is happening each day on the construction site.

Maintenance Building Expansion Takes Shape

Our Maintenance building which was originally estimated to be completed by the end of July is now projected for an August finish for the building structure. A planed catwalk with wash bay for trucks will be added in the Fall as production issues pushed this install back but the full project should be complete before the winter season which will allow all vehicles to be undercover at all times.

Sales Tax Holiday Bigger and Better

Since August of 2019, Ohioans have been getting a break from

paying tax on specific items, which especially benefited families with school-age children, college and higher-education students and teachers preparing to go back to school and mostly included clothing and school supplies priced under \$75.

This year the tax holiday is expanded from a weekend to a full week and will now include most all purchases of individual goods \$500

or less. (There are a few exclusions such as motor vehicles, watercraft, alcohol, tobacco, and vaping and marijuana products).

This year's Sales Tax Holiday runs Tuesday, July 30th at 12:00 a.m. to Thursday, Aug. 8 at 11:59 p.m.
