If you're walking the path or visiting the garden and hear a melodic, high-pitched bird call, you might be listening to this little fella. For the second year in a row, an Eastern Meadowlark, *Sturnella magna*, is making its home in the field to the west of the hall. A beautiful bird, whose numbers are in steep decline, can often be found on the ground or perched in a tree, singing his bright tune. Because this bird is a ground-nester, we're not mowing the west field so we can provide a safe habitat for this threatened, but striking bird. You'll know him by his call and vivid yellow breast.

Delaware General Health District Announces Award

The Delaware General Health District is pleased to announce Delaware County is the healthiest county in Ohio for the fifth year in a row, and 9th overall in the nation!



The 2019 County Health Rankings places Delaware County as first in Ohio for both health outcomes and health factors. Health outcomes focus on how healthy people are presently and health factors are based on how healthy people will be in the future. The rankings, presented by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation and the University of Wisconsin Population Health Institute, are available online at countyhealthrankings.org.

According to the rankings, Delaware County residents engage in the healthiest behavior among Ohio's 88 counties — a ranking covering nine categories, including adult smoking, adult obesity, food environment, physical inactivity, access to exercises opportunities, excessive drinking, alcohol-impaired driving deaths, sexually transmitted infections and teen births.

"This ranking once again reflects the priority our residents have placed on improving the factors that affect their health," Health Commissioner Shelia Hiddleson said. "It also solidifies how important it is to sustain the services and programs that are currently helping residents stay healthy."

Thursday is the service day for the township. Trash will be picked up weekly and recycling will be picked up every other week, with the exception of scheduled holidays when any pick-ups will be Friday. A friendly reminder on trash cart placement. Simply put, the wheels on the trash cart should be towards your house, with the small silver-colored handle on the front of the cart and the lid opening facing the street. This allows the drivers to collect the carts in a more automated, time-saving, safe way. Thanks for your help on this small detail.

We encourage you to always collect your empty trash cans after pick-up as high winds may cause them to blow into the road, creating a traffic hazard. (It keeps our streets and neighborhoods looking nicer, too.)

As a reminder to residents who may not be familiar with the decision, the choice to contract with one hauler was made for several reasons, but the two main ones were:1) Economics (it saved the majority of residents quite a bit on their monthly bill and provided recycling) and 2) Safety/Maintenance (it greatly reduced the number of heavy trucks on our roads daily, making it safer for our children and reducing wear and tear on our roads.
