# **Helpful Info from Delaware County Emergency Communications (Delco Alert)**

Delaware County has 16 outdoor warning sirens. They all turn on even if a weather event is affecting only one small area in the county. In our area there is one at the BST&G Fire Station and one in Galena. A live human being in the Delaware County Emergency

Management Agency office or the Delaware County 9-1-1 Center makes the decision to turn them on.



#### Fun fact: Outdoor warning sirens are meant to be heard outdoors & they tell you to GET INSIDE!

Phone alerts are kicked out automatically when the National Weather Service issues a watch (meaning conditions are ripe for severe weather) or a warning (meaning severe weather is happening now). The NWS can narrowly target locations (aka "geolocate") for their alerts, so very often you might be able to hear a siren but not get an alert. Common sense tip: Stay inside and seek shelter if you hear a siren but haven't gotten an alert. Bonus common sense tip: Stay inside and seek shelter if it's raining cats and dogs, the sky is lit up with lightning and the wind sounds like a freight train!

Sign up for the Delco Alerts system at: <a href="https://emergencycomms.co.delaware.oh.us/delco-alerts/">https://emergencycomms.co.delaware.oh.us/delco-alerts/</a>. Notifications are based on the address you enter.

Another great option for getting information about severe weather is a NOAA weather radio. These units are available on Amazon or from a big box retailer like Walmart, Home Depot or Best Buy, and they only cost about \$30. These are also activated by the NWS's alerts.

If you are experiencing a crisis during a severe weather event, call 9-1-1. If you have a question or a comment that is not an emergency, wait until the event has passed and then contact the Delaware County EMA at 740-833-2180 during normal business hours, Monday-Friday 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m.




## Caregiver Concepts Class coming next month Thursday July 11, 9-10 a.m. at the Township Hall

#### TRASH AND RECYCLING INFORMATION

Thursday is the service day for the township. Trash will be picked up weekly and recycling will be picked up every other week, with the exception of scheduled holidays when any pick-ups will be Friday. THE MAILER YOU RECEIVED FROM RUMPKE HAS YOUR RECYCLING and HOLIDAY CALENDAR ON IT, or you can contact Rumpke at the email above with questions.

A friendly reminder on trash cart placement. Simply put, the wheels on the trash cart should be towards your house, with the small silver-colored handle on the front of the cart and the lid opening facing the street. This allows the drivers to collect the carts in a more automated, time-saving, safe way. Thanks for your help on this small detail.

We encourage you to always collect your empty trash cans after pick-up as high winds may cause

them to blow into the road, creating a traffic hazard. (It keeps our streets and neighborhoods looking nicer, too.)

For residents who may not be familiar with the decision, the choice to contract with one hauler was made for several reasons, but the two main ones were:1) Economics (it saved the majority of residents quite a bit on their monthly bill and provided recycling) and 2) Safety/Maintenance (it greatly reduced the number of heavy trucks on our roads daily, making it safer for our kids and reducing wear and tear on our roads.
