Township Highlights

The township maintains the Berkshire Cemetery which is located across from Bent Tree Golf Course on Rt 36/37. This includes everything from grounds keeping to the actual burials and all paperwork associated. Currently there are just over 935 recorded grave sites.

Berkshire Cemetery

At the time Berkshire Township was established this area was very much a wide open wilderness. The first burials were mainly in the wood near a family's home as there was no cemetery. However, it didn't take long for one to come about. A look back into history, shows there is no official establishment date of the Berkshire Cemetery, but the oldest recorded grave we could find is that of Joann Jones who died on December 18,1813. (pictured right) She lies aside her husband David who followed her on September 20,1814.



Other early graves of mention are that of Major Thomas Brown who's grave dates back to his death in 1816. He was one of the early visitors to the area in 1805 and one of the first residents in 1806. He conducted the first store and hotel. David Prince who organized the first Berkshire Episcopal Church in his home on Easter Monday, March 23, 1818 is laid to rest in our cemetery along with his wife and son. He was one of the first Berkshire Township Trustees. Beyond these of mention, if you were to take the time to wonder the graves you would also find seven that hold men that fought in the Revolutionary War, fourteen that fought in the War of 1812 and some twenty-four Civil War soldiers.

The township recently completed road improvement projects totaling \$135,740 Those projects were, Grader patch and pavement repairs and onyx on Blaney Rd., Full depth construction of Joe Walker Rd. South (in partnership with the Village of Galena), Grader patch and chip sealing of Joe Walker Rd. North, A 2" milling and repaving of Bent Tree Dr., Pavement markings on Fourwinds Dr. and chip sealing on a section of Stockwell Dr.

Twice a year the township performs an inspection on all township roads and grades the roads on the present conditions. We use these grades to assist us in determining, and budgeting for, what projects need completed in the next construction season. We also rely on the Delaware County Engineers Office to support us in the construction projects through the process to construction management.
