Welcome


Chris Sharlike joined the Berkshire Township Team this month. Chris lives in Sunbury and works full time at Sunbury United Methodist Church. Chris

Keep your eye on the Grand Old Flag

On June 14, 1777, the Second Continental Congress took a break from writing the <u>Articles of Confederation</u> and passed a resolution stating that "the flag of the United States be 13 stripes, alternate red and white," and that "the union be 13 stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation."

Over 100 years later, in 1916, President Woodrow Wilson marked the anniversary of that decree by officially establishing **June 14 as Flag Day**.

According to the **U.S. Flag Code**, "The flag, when it is in such condition that it is no longer a fitting emblem for display, should be destroyed in a dignified way, preferably by burning". While this is the preferred way to dispose a flag, it can also be dangerous. A safer alternative to burning the flag is to donate it to your local government or other organization that accepts them. Any VFW or American Legion post will usually have a drop off. The American Legion Department of Ohio at 60 Big Run in Delaware just added a brand new drop box constructed by Tyler Pokorny of Boy Scott Troop 61 as his Eagle Scout project. Ace Hardware in Sunbury accepts old flags as well.

Tractor supply considers itself a chain with a wide variety of agricultural & livestock supplies, plus tools, workwear & boots. When I have visited this store it is much more than that. The


