Permit needed for: Deck Patio with footers of any kind Shed (with or without a foundation) Pole Barn Pool

History of Earth Day

Surprisingly Earth Day was established in 1970. Prior to this there was no Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) nor any clean air or water acts. In other words, there were no legal or regulatory mechanisms to protect our environment.

According to <u>www.epa.gov</u>, the official government website; Senator Gaylord Nelson created Earth Day as a way to force this issue onto the national agenda. Twenty million Americans demonstrated in different U.S. cities, and it worked! In December 1970, Congress authorized the creation of a new federal agency to tackle environmental issues, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

The 18-hole, par 72 course opened for play in July, 2007 with numerous sand traps, ponds, creeks and extensive wetland areas. Public bookings are available daily, Monday - Thursday and Friday - Sunday after 3pm.

The championship course is complemented by a beautiful clubhouse and patio area which is ideal for golf outings, wedding receptions, banquets, corporate events and private parties of up to 200 people. The restaurant is open to the public 10-9 and offer happy hour from 3-6. There is a pool complete with swim lanes and zero entry. Adjacent to the pool are two tennis courts and a large gazebo for casual outdoor dining.

Access to the pool and tennis facilities are part of the Golf Membership, separate Pool and Tennis Memberships can be purchased on an annual basis.

Ohio Outdoor Fire Laws: What you Need to Know

During Spring, wildfire danger is high before plants have turned green. Fire danger is high due to abundant dry leaves and dead grass. Warm, windy weather can also contribute to elevated fire risk. Always use a proper burn barrel when burning outdoors during legal hours. Materials to NEVER burn at anytime in Ohio include: Food Waste, Dead Animals or materials containing rubber, grease, asphalt or made from petroleum

Ohio Revised Code 1503.18 Regarding Kindled Fires

This law prohibits outdoor open burning statewide in unincorporated areas during the months of March, April, May, October and November between the hours of 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. The Ban includes burning of yard waste, trash and debris even in a proper burn barrel.
