



A Note from the Pastor



Dear Parishioners and Friends of Holy Cross,

Blessed Fourth Sunday of Advent—the Lord is near! We celebrate His coming this week on Christmas. There are many beautiful traditional customs that help us commemorate Christ's coming at Christmas. One of these is the St. Andrew Novena prayer that we is customarily prayed 15 times per day from the feast of St. Andrew on November 30 until Christmas.

Hail and blessed be the hour and moment in which the Son of God was born of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in piercing cold. In that hour, vouchsafe, O my God! to hear my prayer and grant my desires, (mention your intentions here) through the merits of Our Savior Jesus Christ, and of His Blessed Mother. Amen.

As we light the last purple candle on our Advent wreath, we recognize that the heavenly light of the Son of God comes into the world while the earthly daylight of the sun begins to reflect that reality with longer days. At Christmas, the Advent wreath is sometimes decorated and becomes a Christmas wreath, hanging upon the door or wall to recall our preparation and signify that our house has been prepared as a home to receive Christ's coming. A Christ candle can be decorated and lit in place of the Advent candles. The Irish used to put a candle in the window to show that their house had been prepared for the coming of Christ, sometimes being a sign that Catholics lived in the house and welcomed the sacramental coming of Christ in the Mass into their homes when the Mass was illegal due to persecution. When asked about the candle, they would say that it was a sign of welcome for Joseph and Mary when they were looking for a place to stay.


On Christmas Eve, the **Vigil of Christmas Mass** (our 7:00pm Mass) prepares us for the coming of Christ as the Gospel recounts the "begots," who begot whom in the genealogy of Christ.


On Christmas Day, there are three Mass texts that present the three "births" of Christ. The first one is the **Mass During the Night** (our 12:00am Midnight Mass) known as the "**Angels' Mass**" because the Gospel presents to us the angels' message to the shepherds that the Christ Child had been born *physically* in Bethlehem.

The Second Mass of Christmas is the **Mass at Dawn** (our 8:00am Mass) known as the "**Shepherd's Mass**" because the Gospel focuses on the response of the Shepherds to go worship the Savior, and therefore commemorates Christ's birth *spiritually* in the hearts of the shepherds by faith.

The Third Mass of Christmas is the **Mass During the Day** (our 10:30am Mass) known as the "**Mass of the Divine Word**" because the Gospel presents Christ's *eternal* birth as the Word from the side of the Father.

In contemplating these three "births" or comings of Christ, may we rejoice to receive Him into our hearts this Christmas and spread that love, joy, and peace of Christmas with those around us. On behalf of Holy Cross Catholic Church, may you all have a very blessed and merry Christmas, and may the Holy Infant King reign in our hearts all year long!






Recalling that praying for the living and the dead is one of the seven spiritual works of mercy, let us pray for one another, especially for those in need of our prayers.

As our monthly expenses are \$25,000, please consider Holy Cross in your donations and in your will.




Catholic Faith Formation Classes







