A Note from the Pastor

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Holy Cross,

Happy Feast of the Most Holy Family and Happy New Year! What great crescendo of graces we received in the Jubilee Year of Hope 2025. We culminate the year with the liturgical celebration of the greatest gift, that is Christ Himself. Now that the Infant King has appeared among us to dwell with us and redeem us of our sins, we contemplate Him along with Joseph and Mary in the Most Holy Family. The liturgical year proposes to us the Infancy and Childhood of Our Lord, along with the domestic virtues that He exemplified in relation to His parents at Nazareth. We will accompany Our Lord through the stages of the Mysteries of His life, which are the Mysteries of our lives too.

Growing up, I remember sitting around the table on New Year's Eve and my family members went around the table recalling 5-10 graces that stood out from the previous year. As we too recall the many and various gifts that God Our Father has given us in the Year of Our Lord 2025, the Church Our Mother invites us to publicly thank God for these gifts by offering us a plenary indulgence. We can obtain this indulgence by devoutly assisting at a recitation or solemn singing of the *Te Deum* on the final day of the year to offer thanks to God for gifts received throughout the course of the year. We will say this *Te Deum* at the end of the **5pm** and **7pm** Masses on **New Year's Eve**.

Then on New Year's Day, when I was growing up, I also remember sitting again around the dinner table and each family member would share some New Year's Resolutions, some hopes and desires of things to accomplish in the coming year. Mother Church likewise encourages us in our resolutions by offering a plenary indulgence to the faithful who devoutly assist either at the recitation or solemn singing of the *Veni Creator* on the first day of the year to implore divine assistance for the course of the whole year, "for God all things are possible." (Mt 19:26) We will say the *Veni Creator* at the end of the **10:30am** Mass on **New Years Day**.

According to the Code of Canon Law (can. 992) and the Catechism of the Catholic Church (n.1471), an **indulgence** is defined as, "*a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints.*"

Indulgences can be gained only once a day, and they can always be applied either to oneself or to the souls of the deceased, but they cannot be applied to other persons living on earth. In order to obtain an indulgence, the faithful must be in the state of grace and:

- have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin;
- have sacramentally confessed their sins (within 20 days before or after);
- receive the Holy Eucharist (it is certainly better to receive it while participating in Holy Mass, but for the indulgence only Holy Communion is required);
- pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff, usually an Our Father and a Hail Mary are suggested.

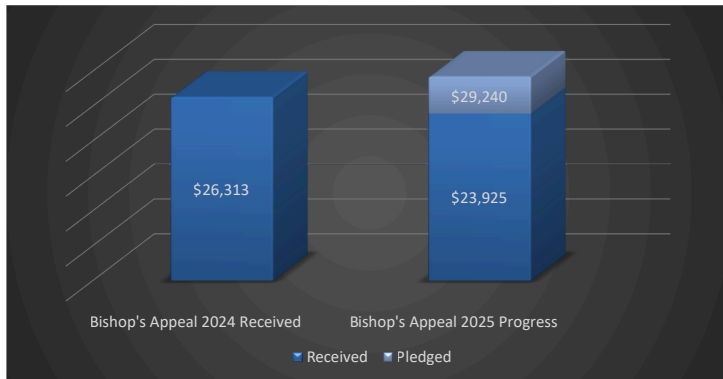

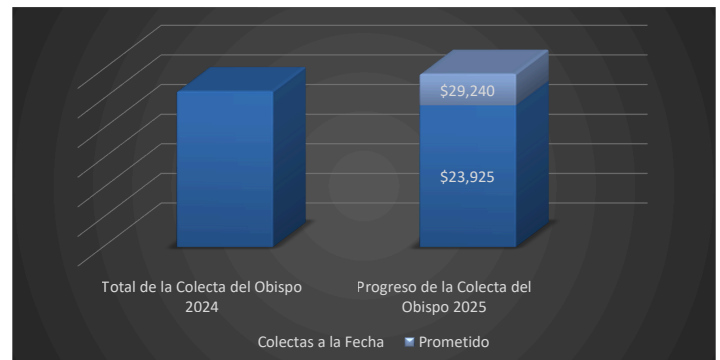

As our monthly expenses are \$25,000, please consider Holy Cross in your donations and in your will.

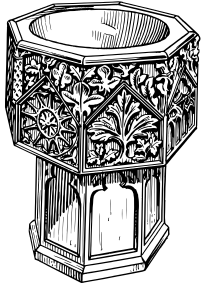

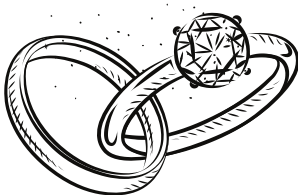

Baptism



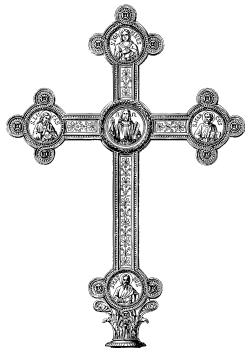
Congratulations on your newborn! In order to prepare for baptism, parents and god parents need to attend baptismal preparation classes before the proposed baptism date.



