

Unique Risks and Uncommon Symptoms

OVERVIEW:

One in five women in the United States will have a stroke in her lifetime. The fact that stroke kills twice as many women as breast cancer, makes it the fourth leading cause of death for women. As alarming as the facts are, and that most women do not know their risk for having a stroke, strokes can be preventable. This activity is designed to provide educational content for neurologists and physicians in related fields regarding the unique challenges for women and stroke risk. Information about the advances in practice, treatment, prevention, and care of the stroke patient, including women experiencing stroke, will be presented. Education for the stroke professional is a vital component to providing quality patient care and achieving excellent patient outcomes long-term.

OBJECTIVES:

1. Identify and summarize data and evidence-based practice for stroke care with a focus on the unique risk factors for women.
2. Appraise challenges presented by cerebrovascular disease to women.
3. Indicate the unique challenges related to women and stroke risk, such as cardiovascular risks.
4. Discuss the importance of cardiovascular health in women.
