










































































































Seasonal Timeline for Pasture Management

Infographic Notes

- Pasture is defined as any intentional area that is managed for the purpose of providing food (annual and perennial crops) for any type of livestock.
- Although the timeline is based on twelve months, seasons are variable and factors such as temperature, precipitation and growth rate should dictate the timing.
- Rotation can occur multiple times within each sub-season. For example, the four pastures can be rotated through once per week during a given month of grazing.
- Scarification (the opening of topsoil) by livestock may be sufficient for preparing topsoil for seeding; however, mechanical means are recommended at least once a year (fall) for successful crop regeneration within the first few years of establishing a new pasture.
