Keep It Simple

House training isn't complicated, but it does take patience, consistency, and a good understanding of your puppy's needs.

The golden rule? No punishment—ever!

If your pup has an accident, calmly **clean it up** using an enzyme cleaner to eliminate the smell. **Do not tell them off.**

Punishment won't teach your puppy where to go—it'll just make them sneak off to do it elsewhere.

Instead, set them up for success by **predicting when they need to go and rewarding them for getting it right.**

Timing Is Everything



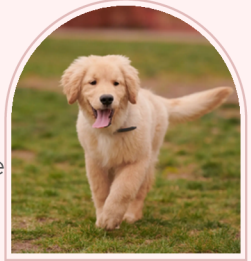
- **Tiny puppy, tiny bladder!** Small puppies can't hold it for long, and if the back door is far away, they might not make it in time.
- **Supervise, supervise, supervise!** If you're consistent, you'll be surprised how quickly they catch on.
- **Learn the signs.** Most puppies will start sniffing around or turning in circles when they're about to go. The moment you see this, get them outside fast!

How To House Train Your Puppy

01

PREVENT ACCIDENTS

Don't give your pup the chance to go in the wrong place



02

TEACH A TOILET CUE

Want your puppy to go on cue? It's easy! Every time they start to go, say your chosen cue ("Go potty" "wee wee" whatever works for you). Keep repeating it, and soon they'll associate the words with the action.

03

PRAISE & REWARD

The moment they go outside, quietly say your toilet cue, then praise and reward with a treat when your puppy has eliminated.

04

BE PATIENT

Mistakes will happen. If they do, just clean up and move on.

Troubleshooting

MY PUPPY CAN'T HOLD IT OVERNIGHT



- Some puppies take longer to hold it overnight—by **14 weeks**, most should manage.
- Always **take them out before bed** and confine them to a small area overnight.
- Puppies don't usually soil their sleeping space, so if yours does, it's worth checking with your vet.

MY PUPPY WON'T GO OUTSIDE



- **Keep the back door closed** and go out with them. To a puppy, an open door doesn't mean "outside is the toilet"—it just means more options!
- **Ditch the puppy pads or newspaper.** These just teach them that going indoors is fine, meaning you have to train them twice—once to pads, then again to the yard.
- If your puppy doesn't go when you take them out. Bring them back inside, but don't let them roam freely. Keep them in a crate, playpen, or right by your side. Then **try again in 15 minutes**.

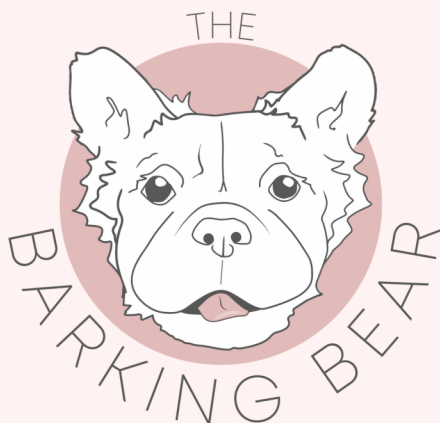
FINAL TIP



House training takes **time and patience**, but if you stick with it, your pup will soon have it mastered. The more consistent you are now, the faster they'll learn—so **stay calm, be encouraging, and celebrate the wins!**
