VIRTUAL FIELD TRIPS, "HOW TO" VIDEOS, AND SPIRIT CHECKS...

This summer we provided our students with video lessons they could watch at their own pace. This was especially helpful to our families who had busy work schedules and limited access to the Internet. The feedback was overwhelmingly positive, and some of our videos had more than 50 views on them! Our instructional videos were offered on four YouTube channels. In the Early Learning Channel, the content was focused on building a strong foundation for success with literacy and math skills. The Intermediate Channel offered creative ways for students to apply math, reading, and social studies skills into their daily lives. The Middle School Channel explored the world through lessons centered on science, mathematics, writing, and social studies. Our virtual field trips were also a big hit - we took students to the Grand Canyon, the Seattle Aquarium, the San Diego Zoo, and other unique places! One of Horizons favorite traditions is the "One School, One Book" project that all of our students participate in, regardless of their grade level. This year we read *Stone Fox*, a book rooted in the theme of overcoming challenges. Our teachers and guest readers each prepared a chapter video for the book so that students could follow along. The readers modeled fluency, promoted text engagement, and supported reading comprehension. Our students also LOVED our teachers' creativity - the costumes and backgrounds truly grabbed everyone's attention!

KIWI KITS AND HANDS-ON LEARNING



STEM instruction has always been an important piece of the Horizons curriculum, and this year allowed us to take a new approach to offering hands-on activities that immersed our students in science. technology, engineering, and math. We were able to provide our Pre-K through 2nd graders with a "Treasure Box" Kiwi Kit and our 3rd-8th graders with a "Arcade Catapult" Kiwi Kit. Our teachers made an assortment of videos that demonstrated how to build the kits and further discussed the engineering behind the activities. They walked the students step-by-step through the build process so that the children felt comfortable assembling the project themselves. Horizons prioritizes hands-on learning and real world applications, and we rely on STEM projects to accomplish this goal.

L.T. WEEK AND "LET'S TALK"

Celebrating LT Goodall's memory everyday with character lessons and citizenship activities

Horizons is not just about academic success, but also about how to become a leader that people can look up to. Every week at Horizons, we focused on a different pillar of character. Our teachers encouraged students to practice caring, fairness, respect, responsibility, trustworthiness, and citizenship throughout the program. They did an incredible job sharing examples of each pillar and ideas for how to exhibit these pillars during their "Let's Talk" lessons. RULER - SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL LEARNING

The Yale Center for Emotional Intelligence provided us with tools to teach our students to recognize, understand, label, express, and regulate their emotions. When an individual can interpret their emotions, they can make positive choices. At Horizons, we utilized a "mood meter" to help students identify their feelings and make intentional choices to problem-solve or self-reflect. Our Health Supervisor and Early Learning Specialist both provided lessons on managing emotions. Their lessons contributed immensely to the emotional health of our students who were facing challenges posed by the pandemic.
