

## Day 75 - Another Level of Thinking

"As the rain and the snow come down from heaven and do not return to it without watering the earth and making it bud and flourish, so that it yields seed for the sower and bread for the eater, so is my word that goes out from my mouth: It will not return to me empty, but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it." (Isaiah 55:10-11)

Are you able to trust God when things seem confusing and chaotic? When Moses approached Pharoah and God started to bring plagues on Egypt, the Israelites were punished. Instead of making bricks with straw, Pharoah ordered them to make them without straw. Think about that for a moment. God found Moses and told him to go to Pharoah and to tell Pharoah to, "let my people go". He sent Moses to deliver them. This should have been great news but, while Moses was informing the people that God had sent him to deliver them, their workload was becoming harder because of him. What they were seeing and experiencing looked nothing like freedom. However, God did fulfill His word in the end.
