Advice to New Beaders

At the October meeting I asked members what advice they would give to a new beader and this is what they said [comments in brackets are mine]:

- Have a good light source [I use an Ott light but that's just one brand]
- Spend the money for a good chain nose pliers and wire cutters and try them first if you can
- Use a tool dip to cover your tools (pliers) when working with wire

- Use an awl to pick out knots in your thread, not the needle
- Have an adequate amount of space to work and don't forget the ergonomics
- Have a good go-to book
- Trust a reputable You Tube source, not just any You Tube video
- Use a good bead mat and tray
- Study before you buy and don't be afraid to ask [anything, from tools to kits to bead components]
- If you're at the bifocal stage, magnifiers (there are lots of options) are a must [I have an Ott light with a magnifier]
- Try to finish one project before starting another [okay, we all got a good laugh at that one]
- Join the Madison Bead Society 😉

Closing thoughts

Back in November I was so happy my trigger finger was getting better, but I resolved to take a break from beading and knitting for the winter; I was afraid of a relapse. So far so good and I can't wait to bead again (I did start knitting a scarf with no problems). I keep finding inspiring projects on Pinterest! But that's why I like Pinterest, I can pin to my heart's content and not spend anything. I do think about what I can share with the membership as I'm scrolling through my feed and I did find a couple more potential projects; I'll bring them to the Feb. meeting and you all can tell me what you think.
