#### March 24th Meeting: Bead Loom [Still on as of this writing]

**Location:** Alicia Ashman Public Library (733 N. High Point Rd.). Meeting is from 6:30 to 8:30, Board meeting at 6:00, any member may attend.

**Presentor:** Mary Jo Schiavoni

**Supplies:** bead loom, beading thread (Nymo will work), size 10 beading needle, 3 colors of seed beads either size 8 or size 10 [Editor's Note: if you haven't done bead looming before, use size 8 beads; if you have some experience with a bead loom, you can mix sizes]

Mary Jo will go over the basics of bead looming. Don't buy one just for the meeting, there will be a couple extra ones at the meeting. Try it out and see if you like it before buying a bead loom. Mary Jo also supplied me with a pattern (last page), so we're all on the same page. I'll have extra copies at the meeting. [I apologize for the smudged flower in the top pattern.]

Each pattern is the same width, 6 strings. Use black or white thread or a color to match the background color you selected.

## **University of Wisconsin Hospital Display - May 2020**

The UW Hospital display is almost here so I hope you've been working on pieces for display/sale; we'll be collecting them soon. To have a good display, we'll need between 75 and 100 pieces. If you do choose to sell, remember that 20% of each sale goes back to the hospital's art fund. Details will be sent in a separate email and again in the next letter. (Promise!)

#### **Closing thoughts**

Still haven't started any beading projects since recovering from trigger thumb, but the scarf I'm knitting is coming along nicely. I'm looking forward to getting some beading materials at the Art Glass and Bead Show to finish some projects.

April Meeting: I presented two projects to the members at the February meeting and the winner was "Bugle Boardwalk Bracelet." This pattern calls for at least 55 twisted bugle beads (2x12 mm), size 11 seed beads, beading thread (the pattern calls for Nymo but I'm going to use Fireline), and beading wire (pattern calls for C-Flex beading wire (0.012), but I'm going to use Softflex), and a 2-strand box clasp.
