ETSY WEBSITE SOLD CONSECRATED HOSTS WITHOUT REALIZING WHAT IT WAS DOING



Editor's note: Etsy's website connects people looking for unique goods with independent sellers around the world. When you shop on Etsy.com, you can choose from millions of handmade, vintage, and craft supply items created and curated by millions of independent sellers.

On May 7, 2019, the Etsy account "Pentagora" claimed to be selling "Real Catholic Hosts, consecrated by a priest." The hosts were advertised "...to abuse for classic black fairs or black magic purposes." The listing claimed to be selling a package of nine hosts that had been consecrated in Germany.

In the following days, the listing drew attention on Twitter, with critics arguing that it violated Etsy's policies. The popular online marketplace only allows for the sale of items that are handmade, vintage, or craft supplies. Stolen items are explicitly prohibited, as are items that "support or glorify

hatred toward people or otherwise demean people based upon: race, ethnicity, national origin, religion, gender, gender identity, disability, or sexual orientation."

A few days later, the listing for the consecrated hosts was marked as "Sold Out." It was subsequently deleted.

On May 13, a Change.org petition was started, calling on Etsy to clarify that the sale of consecrated hosts is a violation of the platform's policies.

"Catholics believe that Consecrated Hosts are truly the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ. It is the most precious thing in our religion," the petition said.

"It is given freely, and so the only reason anyone could ever have to sell it would by definition be illicit. To sell them 'for abuse' is hateful against the Catholic Church, and should be prohibited by Etsy."

The petition recognized that Etsy does not screen individual listings, but said that "to prevent this happening again, we ask that Etsy add 'Consecrated Hosts' to their already strict list of prohibited items."

By the following day, the petition had gained more than 7,500 signatures. Jess Kallberg, policy manager for Etsy, responded to the petition May 14, confirming that "the reselling of consecrated hosts is a violation of our policies."

Santo Niño de Cebú Celebrated Annually in the Philippines

Just before everything went horribly wrong and he wound up dead on the beach of Cebu, Magellan presented this small sacred figure, along with other religious gifts, to the Cebu chieftain's wife Hara Amihan to celebrate their conversion to Christianity.

The elaborately dressed carved wooden figure, believed to be of Belgian origin, traveled with Magellan on his voyage of discovery and conquest from Spain to the Philippines, making this the oldest Catholic treasure in the islands.

After Magellan's death at the hands of angry locals in April 1521, the little Jesus disappeared until 1565, when it was rediscovered. The oldest church in the Philippines, the Basilica Minore

del Santo Niño, is said to be built over the spot where it was found. The basilica has burned to the ground twice, and was bombed during WWII, but the little Santo Niño escaped unscathed.

The Feast of Santo Nino is held locally on the second Sunday in January, followed immediately by the nine-day long Sinulog festival, celebrating the local conversion to Christianity with parades, music, and dance.

Magellan's death is re-enacted locally every April.

Editor's Note: Our parish recently learned of the Santo Niño de Cebú when a woman who was born in the Philippines had her funeral in St. Jerome's. Santo Niño was placed on her casket.

The Supreme Council office has announced the winners of the 2018-19 Fr. McGivney Star Council Award. Our council, *The Divine Mercy of Jesus Council 17249*, was among the winners.

Councils winning the Star Council Award numbered 1,247. The award is presented when a council meets or exceeds a 2.5 percent net gain of insurance members for the fraternal year (councils under 100 members need a net gain insurance quota of 3 new members).

Awards are now being engraved and will be sent to district deputies and, if requested, to the state deputy.

How Great Thou Art --The History of the Hymn



The history of the hymn *How Great Thou Art* begins with Mr. Carl Gustaf Boberg (1859-1940). He was a Swedish pastor, editor, and member of the Swedish parliament. Mr. Boberg was enjoying a nice walk when a thunderstorm suddenly appeared out of nowhere. A severe wind began to blow. After the storm was over, Mr. Boberg looked out over the clear bay. He then heard a church bell in the distance. And the words to *How Great Thou Art* begin to form in his heart -- O Lord, my God, When I in awesome wonder, consider all the worlds Thy hands hath made. . . Can you imagine what Boberg felt as he formed these words? There was such calmness after the fierce storm he could only utter those words of peace. This poem was published in 1891 in *Witness of the Truth*, the weekly newspaper that Boberg edited. It was later translated in German. In 1927, it was published in a Russian version. *How Great Thou Art* was translated by Stuart K. Hine, an English missionary to Ukraine. He found some version of the Russian text and sang it at an evangelistic meeting with his wife. He then translated the first three stanzas into English, which was sung at an evangelistic meeting in England during World

War One. He published the first three verses in 1949. He later wrote the fourth verse as a triumphant message of life eternal. Of the hymn's importance he said: "When we reach that heavenly home, we will fully understand the greatness of God, and will bow in humble adoration. May we all live in such a way that we will be ready when Jesus Christ appears to receive the saints. Our heavenly home awaits us, all of those who have received Christ in obedience." *How Great Thou Art* was sung by George Beverly Shea at the London Crusade of the Billy Graham evangelistic team in 1954. He eventually sang this song over 100 times. during a revival in New York at a Billy Graham Crusade. This caused the hymn to receive new attention in Sweden and America and be published in several songbooks. Today millions across the world continue to sing this beautiful song. Giving God all praise, glory, and honor for who He is -- the Creator of this universe.

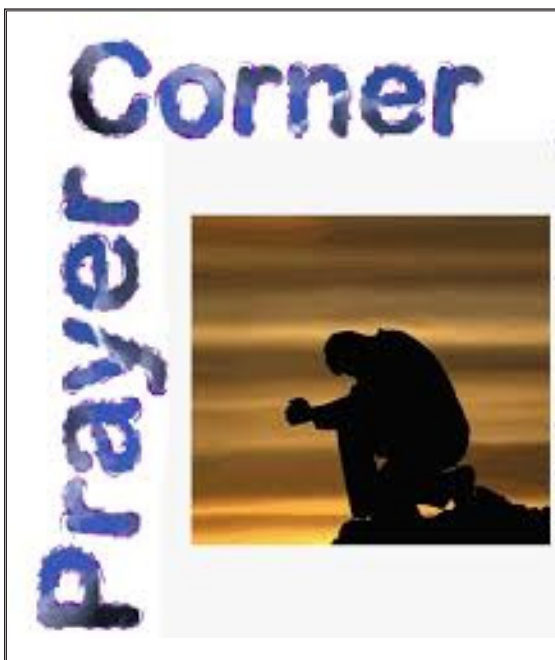

SPOTLIGHT on The Lifeline Ministry

“As the story goes,” said Fred Bach, the director of Lifeline, “the founder of LifeLine was Ed Fowler. He was on a destroyer in WWII. It was destroyed in battle, but Ed was saved by a life line. He said that since God had saved him, he would give back to him by giving a lifeline to others.” And thus, in 1983, Lifeline was born. “We serve the community,” said Fred. “In 2018 we served an average of 237 families per month for a total of around 700 people. No one is turned away, although they are supposed to be limited to once a month. We are not hard-nosed about that.” Although Lifeline is advertised in the bulletin, Fred thinks mainly clients become aware of it by

word of mouth. Lifeline is a part of Feeding Tampa Bay, a non-profit supplier for food banks. As a result, Lifeline gets much free food. “We get meat at 18 cents a pound,” Fred said. “It’s food from various grocery stores that want to clear their shelves. It’s immediately frozen and remains good until distributed.”

He goes there every other week and usually brings home about 700 pounds of meat. Every Tuesday free produce is delivered. Recently they received 700 pounds of bell peppers and 300 pounds of tomatoes. Walmart also always gives them a good price on eggs. Publix supplies free bread and bakery items. Whatever else they need, they turn to parishioners with a list of items stapled to a paper bag. “We are normally in very good shape,” Fred said.

As for volunteers, “...we have plenty, around 45 or 50. I think we may be the biggest ministry at St. Jerome’s. Many of the other ministries help us: The Silly Sinatras, the Knights of Columbus, Early Childhood Center, Faith Formation, Bingo, to name a few.”

“Even though we might appear to be a beach community,” he said, “there are many retired seniors who are raising children and grandchildren. They need help.”

Clients cannot request food items. They are given boxes of food depending on the size of the family. Liability prevents clients from freely roaming the facility and picking out what they want.

Lifeline is open every Wednesday from 8:30-11:30 a.m. throughout the year, except Christmas and the day before Thanksgiving. It is also open on the last Saturday of the month.

When I was in the 5th grade, Miss Karshevski, my teacher, planned a wonderful field trip: a boat ride on the Island Queen down the Ohio River in

I remember a time when we were walking around Vincennes, my hometown, and found a huge mountain of corncobs. We immediately began climbing the pile, only to sink quickly and need help getting out. A man came along, saw us, helped us out, and yelled at us to "beat it!" What a dangerous adventure that was.

Nile Barnes, my best friend at the time, and I tried to imagine the many wonderful things we could do on the boat. We didn't care much about the river, only having fun on the boat. I easily relied on Nile to come up with ideas, since he had already demonstrated that ability many times in our short lives.

In one of Fr. Tom's recent homilies, he stated something we all know: "Be careful who your friends are." How I wish I had listened to my mom when I was growing up, because she tried many times to stop my friendship with Nile. I now know he was bad news and could have really impacted my life.

For example, I remember one time we were walking down the sidewalk and passed some concrete steps that led into a business. At the bottom of the steps was a pile of leaves. Nile quickly took a match out of his pocket (he always carried matches, although he didn't smoke) and after lighting it, threw it into the leaves. As soon as they caught fire, we began running. A man from inside almost immediately opened the door and yelled, "Stop!" Guess which one of us stopped.

Once we got to Evansville, IN, we quickly boarded the Island Queen and began looking for an adventure. At Nile's suggestion, we quickly began sliding across the dance floor but were yelled at as soon as we started, so we went up a flight of stairs to the second level. Nile immediately determined that it would be great fun to begin spitting on the poor fools who were walking below us, so of course I did what he said. Miss Karshevski came walking up the steps, saw what we were doing, and came over to us, grabbing one ear each. She said because of my terrible act, she was going to take away my being captain of the patrols. It broke my heart. She had hit home. As for Nile, I don't remember him being punished at all. Go figure.

It still didn't register, though, that Nile was an extremely bad influence on me. We had gone through all six grades of elementary school together, and by the time we were in grade six, we were the only two students in what was called 6B, the second semester of sixth grade. I'll use that as an excuse for my devotion to him.

Another time, Nile and I were walking down an alley; he took out one of his ever-present matches, threw it into the garage on a pile of something, and off we flew. Not long after, we heard fire engines but didn't have enough courage to return to the scene of the crime. There's no doubt in my mind that we started a fire.

On the first day we entered junior high school, we rode our bicycles. We had to get off them to get up some steps, but then we hopped on again as we rode toward the bike stands. A patrol tried his best to get us off, but Nile kept on riding with a great big smile on his face and with me right behind. Suddenly there was Mr. Stevens, the shop teacher, glaring at us. I guess he was in charge of the bike area. After yelling at us to get off our bikes, he took us to his room and showed us a huge paddle. Luckily, we got only a warning, but I realized it was a close call.

For some reason, I slowly came to my senses about Nile as I got more immersed in 7th grade. That's probably because I picked up new friends. I do remember, though, that one day he threw a lit firecracker out a second-story window of homeroom. He got a paddling for that incident.

Our homeroom happened to also be the chemistry room. The counter had a sink and a bunsen burner by each seat, and Nile tried his best to see what kind of flame the gas escaping from its source would make, but I guess Mr. Decker had the gas turned off when chemistry class was not in session. Whew!

One day in our senior year Nile asked me to go for a joy ride with him. I wasn't sure what he meant, but thanks be to God I said no. He stole a car but was easily caught. He spent some time in a boys' school but got out soon enough to finish the senior year. I'm proud to say that our friendship was over. Thank you, Jesus!

Several years ago, I went to one of our high school reunions, hoping that Nile would be there but not really expecting it. Lo and behold, there he was! As we shook hands, I felt something in his hand. I looked down and there was a match! No comment needed.

How grateful I am that God was watching over me in those formative years. My faith is strengthened by that knowledge.

Pope Francis Claims Former US Televangelist Performed Miracle, Paving Way for Sainthood

Pope Francis has declared that a late US television preacher once performed a miracle, moving him one step closer to sainthood.

The Vatican announced on Saturday the formal approval of the miracle, thought to relate to claims about a baby's extraordinary recovery in an Illinois hospital.

The Diocese of Peoria believes that Archbishop Fulton J Sheen – who died in 1979 – interceded in 2010 on behalf of a baby who began breathing 61 minutes after showing no signs of life at birth.

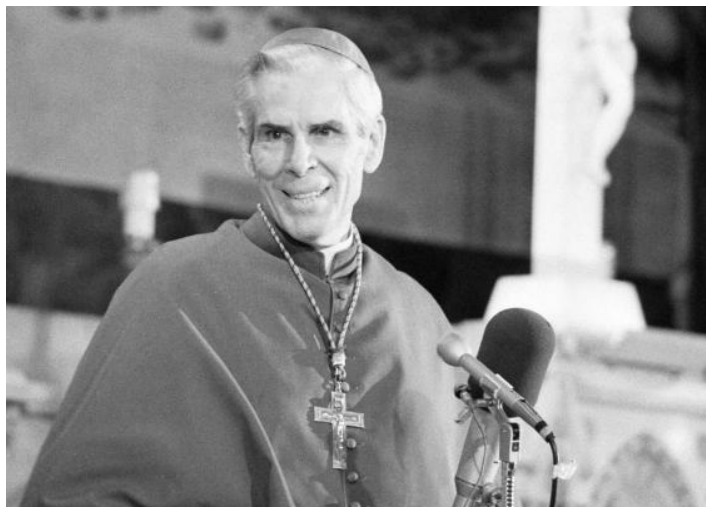
One miracle allows a candidate for sainthood to be beatified in the Catholic faith, but a second miracle must be approved in order for sainthood to be conferred.

No date has been given for his beatification ceremony, but the Peoria Diocese said it was beginning preparations for the celebration in the central Illinois city.

Archbishop Sheen's on-air evangelism made him a well-known figure in the US over several decades, having started on NBC radio in 1930 with a weekly programme called The Catholic Hour.

He expanded to television in 1950 with NBC's Life is Worth Living, regularly amassing more than 30 million viewers.

The pope's decision comes just weeks after a New York



court ruling allowing the American archbishop's niece to bury him in Peoria, where he was ordained, ending years of litigation and allowing the process for sainthood to resume.

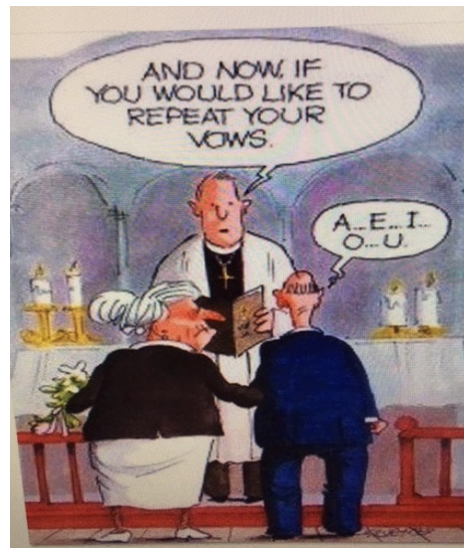

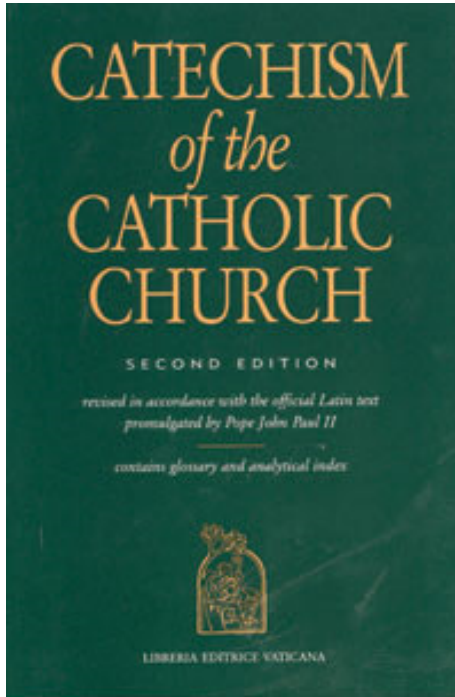

What does the Catechism say about Christian Funerals?

1684 The Christian funeral is a liturgical celebration of the Church. The ministry of the Church aims at expressing efficacious communion with the deceased, at the participation in that communion of the community gathered for the funeral.

1685 The different funeral rites express the Paschal character of Christian death and are in keeping with the situations and traditions of each region, even as to the color of the liturgical vestments worn.

1686 The Order of Christian Funerals of the Roman liturgy gives three types of funeral celebrations: the home, the church, and the cemetery, and according to the importance attached to them by the family, local customs, the culture, and popular piety.

1687 A greeting of faith begins the celebration. Relatives and friends of the deceased are welcomed with a word of consolation. The community assembling in prayer also awaits the words of eternal life. The death of a member of the community is an event that should lead beyond the perspectives of this world and should draw the faithful into the true perspective of faith in the risen Christ.

1688 The liturgy of the Word during funerals demands very careful preparation because the assembly present for the funeral may include some faithful who rarely attend the liturgy and friends of the deceased who are not Christians. The homily in particular must avoid the literary genre of funeral eulogy and illumine the mystery of Christian death in the light of the risen Christ.

1689 When the celebration takes place in church, the Eucharist is the heart of the Paschal reality of Christian death. It is by the Eucharist that the community of the faithful, especially the family of the deceased, learn to live in communion with the one who has fallen asleep in the Lord.

1690 A farewell to the deceased is his final commendation to God by the Church. It is the last farewell by which the Christian community greets one of its members before his body is taken to its tomb. We shall never be separated, for we live for Christ, and now we are united with Christ as we go toward him. We shall all be together in Christ.
