KEENE RUNWAY 5K REGISTRATION EXCEEDS EXPECTATIONS

(**KEENE**, **NH**) The Dillant-Hopkins Airport has been cleared for takeoff for the inaugural Keene Runway 5K. The first-ever Runway 5K will occur Saturday, April 6, 2024, with proceeds benefiting the Keene Senior Center.

"Registration has already exceeded expectations and there's still two weeks left," said Emily Graves of Tri-State Racing who is managing the race timing. "This event is particularly exciting because participants will be on the actual runway which is a perfect surface for runners to achieve their best time."

Participants will run or walk on a closed course which is flat and completely paved, making it stroller and wheelchair friendly. Only registered participants will have access to the runway, and pets are not allowed.

The event starts at 9 AM and all participants must be off the runway by 10:30 AM for the airport to reopen. Spectators will be able to see the entire race and cheer from the sidelines.

"As a runner, I'm always looking for new and exciting places to run," said Ockle Johnson, avid runner and President of the Keene Senior Center Board. "This is the first time a race like this has been held in Keene, and thanks to our race director, Sally Rinehart, and a hard working committee, it will actually take flight."



You must register to participate - \$35 per person through 3/30 and \$40 after that. T-shirts are not guaranteed for participants who register after 3/30. Children (14 and under) must be accompanied by a registered adult.

There are prizes for men and women in each age bracket and the fastest overall male and female runners each win a free flying lesson, compliments of Monadnock Aviation. There will also be prize drawings for registered participants, plus door prizes and a raffle open to all. All prizes have been donated by our generous local merchants, guaranteeing a great event.

WANT TO TRY THE HANDBELLS?




Directions: Enter at the UCC back door (where the parking is) and either take the steps or the elevator to the second floor. The venue will be off of that corridor.

HAND BELL FUN FACTS



- Handbell ringing started in England in the late 1690s.
- Ringers wear gloves because their hand oils will tarnish the bell.
- The metal alloy the bells are made of seems sturdy but will pit easily from salvia (so no gum chewing!)
- Most ringers play one bell in each hand, but there are some very talented solo ringers who manage multiple bells per hand.






