

Reconstruction Progress Inside and Out

The grading of the southwest quadrant of the playground to prepare the soil for upcoming planting of the natural prairie is complete. The grass seeds have been purchased from Valley Feed & Seed in Wichita with planting to take place soon. If you want to participate, call the museum and let us know. The Prairie Team is participating in the Earth Partnership for Schools mid-winter class on January 17 at the Dyck Arboretum in Hesston. Work is in progress on the south side of the limestone building to allow rainwater to drain away from the school building. All of this "dirt work" is being done by Bruce Sanderson, retired USD259 landscaper, and will augment the upcoming repair of the building guttering system.

Volunteers completed the 2025 Kansas Heritage Trust Fund (KHTF) grant application in the fall requesting funds to repair the windows of the 1930s building. KHTF awards will be announced as early as the end of February. Our 2024-2025 Light the Way for History fundraising campaign is currently ongoing, with received funds to be applied toward operational expenses such as electricity, heating, and cooling. Donations for this campaign may be made at the museum during regular hours, mailed to the address on the front of the newsletter, or you can go online at **savemccormick.com**. Remember, McCormick School Museum is a 501(c)3 organization, so your donation is tax deductible to the fullest extent allowed by law.

By the end of January, we will submit an application to the Kansas State Historic Preservation Office for approval on our next reconstruction project. This provides us with specific guidance for each task and allows us to receive tax credits for our expenditures. Work on the limestone building will include the reconstruction of the cornice guttering system, repainting of the windows and repair of water damaged interiors. We also plan to add an audio/ video system to the multi-purpose room and a lighted sign on the premises. Once the project proposal is approved, work will commence.

As the building needs of MSM are extensive, donations from readers and friends and financial awards are essential to offset expenses. 
Museum Notes
