Needs of the Museum

Recently, MSM was awarded \$5,000 from the City of Wichita Division of Arts and Cultural Services to be used for Operational expenses in 2025. Also, the MSM grant writing committee submitted an application on November 1st for the 2025 Kansas Heritage Trust Fund (KHTF) grant requesting funds to repair the windows of the 1930s building. KHTF awards will be announced in the spring. Our 2024-2025 Light the Way for History fundraising campaign is currently ongoing through January 12, 2025 with received funds to be applied toward operational expenses such as electricity, heating, and cooling. Donations for this campaign may be made at the museum during regular hours, mailed to the address on the front of the newsletter, or you can go online



at savemccormick.com. Remember, McCormick School Museum is a 501(c)3 organization, so your donation is tax deductible to the fullest extent allowed by law.

The building needs of MSM continue to be extensive even though recent donations and financial awards have helped to remedy some building deficiencies. In addition to repeated vandalism incidents, the cornice guttering system is in need of repair. Water ingress in various locations has caused interior plaster damage in several classrooms. A portion of the ceiling in the principal's office has recently fallen, causing damage to artifacts and furnishings below. One urgent need is to restore the wooden bell tower atop the 1890s building. Upon recent inspection, the tower base was found to be in such a deteriorated state that it is no longer safe for visitors to ring the bell. Finally, the capstones of the 1930s building parapets have lost their original mortar and new mortar needs to be reapplied to preserve the integrity of the red brick building.

MSM volunteers are working hard to find funds to further the reconstruction progress and to cover operational costs. You can help through participation in one or more of MSM's fundraising campaigns. We appreciate contributions of all sizes. Please come by and visit us soon, so we can wish you a happy and prosperous holiday season.
