


Technician Appointments

Preventative medicine is the best medicine. Annual bloodwork and internal parasite testing can help your veterinarian detect early signs of illness, so they can be treated or prevented. We partner with IDEXX to provide a comprehensive blood panel and internal parasite testing every year.

Annual bloodwork and intestinal parasite testing are included in the listed price for your pet's health. See below for more information on what these tests include.



What are heartworms?

Heartworms are parasitic worms that live in the heart and lungs of dogs and other animals. They are transmitted through the bite of an infected mosquito. When a mosquito bites an infected animal, it picks up heartworm larvae in the animal's blood. The larvae then develop in the mosquito and are transmitted to another animal when the mosquito bites them.

Once the larvae are in the new animal's bloodstream, they travel to the heart and lungs where they mature into adult worms. The travel takes about 6 months. Adult heartworms can live for up to 7 years in an infected animal and can cause serious health problems, including heart failure, lung disease, and death.

To renew your pet's heartworm prescription annually, we require a heartworm test. However, if you purchase a year's supply of heartworm prevention from us,



HEARTWORM PREVENTION

Heartworm disease is a serious and potentially fatal condition, but it is preventable. By giving your pet a monthly heartworm preventive medication and taking other preventive measures, you can help to protect your pet from this disease.

There are a number of different heartworm prevention options available. We carry Interceptor, a monthly tablet, in our clinic. We will soon be carrying ProHeart12, a 12-month injection. Other popular options that are available on our online pharmacy include NexGuard Combo and Simparica Trio. Both of these options are once-monthly chewables that also protect against fleas and ticks.
