Grace Thurston Arnold Albee is a treasured American printmaker. Grace had a career of 50-60 years and has produced more than 250 prints in her career.

Ms. Albee was born in Scituate, Rhode Island and became captivated with etched illustrations from her grandfather's books when she was young. She went to Rhode Island School of Design (1910-1912) where she met her husband Percy F. Albee (1883-1958), a muralist and lithographer. They got married in 1913 and moved to Providence, Rhode Island. During this time, they had five sons together and Grace's main priority during this time was to raise her family.

Grace and her family moved to Montparnasse, Paris (1928-1933) and was able to establish herself as an artist. She exhibited her works in galleries and salons in Paris to eventually hold an exhibit at the American Library in Paris. Grace then moved to New York City (1933-1938) and was made a member of the National Academy of design in 1946 as the first printmaker to become a member.

She moved around to Bucks County, Pennsylvania (1937-1962), Kew Gardens, New York (1962-1974), and Barrington and Bristol, Rhode Island (1974-1983). Throughout her life, she used her surroundings to create her prints that can be seen in multiple museums across the United States today.

Jennie “Jen” Mae MacLeod Ayres became interested in art when she was younger while her aunts who were involved in the arts introduced her. During high school her drawings were featured in the school’s literary journal, the Critic, and was voted class artist. Jen then had the opportunity to have a commercial art experience with the Art Student League in New York City. She then studied under Marion Junkin at Richmond Professional Institute

Jen married Warren Davis Ayers Jr. in 1938 and had two children together. After some time in New York City, she moved home and started to gain recognition for her work in the 1950s. Winning awards in Roanoke and exhibiting a one-woman show in New York City for the American Medical Association 1953 help kick-start her career in art.

She is known for her portraits and more specifically her pastel portraits of Lynchburg’s baby boom generation. Jen taught at Lynchburg College for four years while she was taking lessons herself at Randolph-Macon Women’s College from Pierre Daura and studies at the Brooklyn Museum from Rufino Tamayo.

Jen was highly active in the art world as she taught classes and works with multiple different mediums. She exhibited at the Atlanta Museum Southeastern Exhibition in 1958, Virginia Museum of Fine Arts Annual exhibition in 1959 and Madison Avenue at the Little Studio. Jen was diagnosed cancer and sought out treatment but was she able to continue painting throughout her illness.

Faye Patterson Burnett was a beloved member of the Lynchburg Art Club and Lynchburg Fine Arts Center. Her interest in art started with her mother handing her a pencil and paper during church to keep her busy. She took classes at the University of Virginia in the 1950s and entered her first art competition in 1968.

Mrs. Burnett worked in oil, acrylic and watercolor, with a focus painting landscapes, still life, portraits, and figure studies. Has received multiple prizes and awards for her art at the Roanoke Sidewalk Art Show, Technical Arts Show, Bath County Arts Show, Lynchburg art Festival, and Staunton Outdoor Show.

In 1971, Mrs. Burnett's acrylic painting *Despair*, posed by Edith Smith, won best in show for the Bath Regional Art Show. She exhibited her work at the Washington and Lee University's duPoint Gallery in 1974. Faye was able to exhibit with her husband, Eugene Franklin Burnette (photographer and painter) at the Dillard Art Gallery of the Fine Arts Center in 1975.

Faye worked as a Technical Illustrator for General Electric Co. and a graphic artist for Frank Wright Studios and Babcock & Wilcox. She was also a member of the Quaker Memorial Presbyterian Church and taught lessons to aspiring artists. In 1978 she created a series of caricatures featuring 28 members of the Lynchburg Art Club in preparation for the annual outdoor art show.

Kerttu Cassen was born in Finland and became interested in art when she moved to New York City. Her interest in art expanded when she taught at Indianan University During World War II. While her husband, Leonard, was away in the service, she frequently visited art galleries.

When she moved to Lynchburg she began to study under Georgia Morgan and Don Evans, a professor of art and chairman of the art department at Lynchburg College. She completed her studies under the direction of Hal McIntosh, Bob Harman, and John Duncan, all of which were former art directors at the Lynchburg Fine Arts Center.

She was a member of the Art Students Guild in Florida and the Co-Operative Fifth Avenue Art Gallery. Cassen has won numerous awards with her paintings and many of her works hand in private collections in the United States and Finland.

Howard Coleman was influenced to make art by his grandmother, Margaret Faidley, who was a painter and writer. He was a dedicated member of the Lynchburg Art Club as a full time artist, teacher and expert in art restoration.

In 1946-1948 he studied at the Corcoran Art School in Washington, where he attended both day and night classes and exhibited in student exhibitions. He studied under Georgia Morgan and Margaret Helbig (1941-1945).

He held his first one-man show in Lynchburg in 1948 and was known for his portraiture and various techniques and media. He founded the Lynchburg Art Festival in 1973 and has served as a Chairman for the Lynchburg Civic Art Exhibition in 1957.

He continued to create through his time in the United States Army by involving himself in theatrics. He designed sets, costumes and music for his play in the European Command Play Competition. This play won prizes and was translated to German and performed at the Munich Shaupiel Haus.

Throughout his life he won numerous awards including a Certificate of Distinction from the Virginia Museum and an Honorable Mention for a painting in the Spring Annual Exhibition of the Lynchburg Art Club.

Pierre Daura

Pierre Daura

21 February 1896 - 1 January 1976

Pierre Daura was born in Minorca, Spain and grew up in Barcelona, Spain. One of his godparents encouraged Daura's interest in painting. He pursued a career in art by studying at the Llotja Art Academy in Barcelona with Pablo Picasso's Father as one of his teachers. In 1914 Daura left Spain for Paris where officials changed his name on his identity card to Pierre, from his birth name Pere Francesc Joan Daura I García.

He settled in Montmartre, Paris, designing fabrics for Couturiers and apprenticing under Émile Bernard. Bernard taught him philosophies of Paul Cézanne, Paul Gauguin, and Vincent Van Gogh. He married an American painter, Louis Blaire in 1928. He founded Cercle et Carré (Circle and Square), a group who values geometric abstraction, with his friends Joaquín Torres-García and Michel Seuphor in 1929.

Daura and his wife and daughter settled in a small town in the south of France for a decade, traveling consistently to Virginia before settling there in 1939 during WWII. He gained naturalized U.S. citizenship in 1943. His inspiration came from the Blue Ridge Mountains. He is known for landscapes, portraits, still lifes and religious scenes. Daura taught at Washington and Lee University, Lynchburg College, and Randolph-Macon Women's College. After teaching, He became a full-time painter in Rockbridge Baths, Virginia in his studio he built.

In the late 1950s, his work became more vibrant and expressive as he found more joy in painting. He exhibited multiple times a year in Lexington, Lynchburg, Roanoke, and Staunton. The Virginia military institute commissioned him to design the New Market Metal in 1962.

He painted well in to his later years until he passed away from pneumonia in 1976. His Daughter dispersed his works to museums and galleries across the United States, France and Spain. Lynchburg College started the Daura Gallery in memory of Pierre.

Mary Sampson Diuguid

Mary Sampson Diuguid

1883 – 1968

Miss Mary Sampson Diuguid was a Lynchburg Art Club member for at least 40 years from 1928, the earliest roster available, until she died in 1968. She is listed as a member in 1945, 1952 and 1962. She chaired the Art Department of the Lynchburg Women's Club from 1923-1925 and was instrumental in the revival of the Lynchburg Art Club in the late 1920's.

Mary and her sister, Anna Diuguid Turner, were daughters of William and Nora Cottrell Diuguid. Her father was owner – director of the Diuguid Funeral Home which was founded by his father Sampson Diuguid in 1817. Mary Diuguid was president of W. D. Diuguid, Inc. from 1927-1946.

She was a graduate of Randolph-Macon Woman's College, where she studied art under Louise Jordan Smith. She also attended both the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts and the School of Industrial Arts in Philadelphia. She studied under Pierre Daura and Hendry B. Snell in Lynchburg, Arthur Corey in Clearwater, Florida and others. She also Studied in Cintra, Portugal during the summer of 1928 under Mr. Snell and spent many winters in Florida and Mexico.

Mary Diuguid's work was selected for exhibition at the Academy Galleries in Richmond, Corcoran Gallery of Art in Washington, the Art Institute of Tampa Florida, the National Art Club Galleries of New York City and the Virginia Museum of Fine Art. She was listed in *Who's Who* in American Art for several Years.

Miss Diuguid had solo exhibition at the Lynchburg Art Club in 1933 and 1966. She has exhibited Danville Art Center (1933), Randolph Macon Women's College Gallery (1949), Altavista Women's Club (1950), Georgia Morgan Guild Studio (1954) and Lynchburg Art Center (1957).

She was elected to the Washington Watercolor Club of the Corcoran Art Gallery (1934) and the Plastics Club of Philadelphia (1940). She was selected as a finalist in competition for Virginia Paintings to be exhibited at the 1939 World's Fair in New York.

The 1941 Club Christmas party was held at the home of Mary Diuguid and Anna Diuguid Turner, which indicated that they shared a home at the time. Mary Diuguid gave away all her paintings shortly before her death in 1968.

Flavius James Fisher

Flavius James Fisher

9 February 1833 – 8 May 1905

Flavius James Fisher was born in Wytheville County and was raised in East Tennessee. He was the son of Jacob Fisher and Rebecca Rader Fisher. From a young age, Flavius was talented and interested in art. He married Elizabeth Patten Brewer on June 27, 1883 and they had one son together.

In 1855, he settles in Richmond and became friends with the sculpture, Edward Virginius Valentine. He exhibited two works at Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts in Philadelphia in 1858. Flavius went to Germany in 1859 and was one of the first Americans admitted to the Berliner Kunstakademie, The Academy of Arts in Berlin. He studied under Julius Friedrich Anton Schrader. He stayed in Europe and also studied in London and Paris.

He was known for his portraits of Lynchburg residents, landscapes, and historical paintings. Flavius was commissioned to paint a former governor of Tennessee in 1870 and three former governors of Virginia. During a trip to Cleveland, Tennessee, a devastating fire in November 1868 destroyed his Lynchburg Studio including many studies and sketches.

He moved to Richmond in 1874 and set up a studio then established a permanent studio in downtown Washington D.C. in 1882. He was a member of the Washington Art Club from 1876 to 1877. Flavius has works in many permanent collections including the Virginia State Artwork Collection, Lynchburg Museums, Tennessee State Museum, the Valentine, the Virginia Museum of History and Culture, and many others.

Frances was a founding member of the Art Club in 1895 having been a student of Mr. Guttman's First adult art class in Lynchburg. She was an indefatigable worker in the organizational days of the Federal Art Gallery and the Civic Art League and the Art Alliance.

She exhibited at the club regularly showing her water colors and come painted china as well. She was a founding member of the Lynchburg Women's Club and served on its Art Committee.

She exhibited continually from 1897 to her death in 1939 in Lynchburg, Norfolk, Richmond and other cities in Virginia. She won numerous awards for her work as it was described as "admirable watercolors showing clear colorful medium decoratively conceived and well presented."

She was a student of Bernard Guttman and Henry Snell and others who taught at the club.

She was related to Lynchburg Artist Anne Massie and survived by her granddaughter, Jane Bowden. Frances lived in the Lemon – Frost house at 1401 Harrison Street in the Diamond Hill Historic District.

Anne van de Graaf was born in Cape Town, Africa. She was raised in East Africa and England. She moved to England just before World War II broke out. Her father was English but went to East Africa after World War I and met her mother there. Anne's work is highly reflective of her time in Africa.

She attended Nottingham University and spent time traveling through Europe, where she met her husband, J.J (Hans) van de Graaf. They spent two years in Lebanon after their marriage. They immigrated to the United States in 1956 in hopes of better work opportunities. They ended in Syracuse, NY for her husband's work before he got transferred to Lynchburg, VA in 1958. They became naturalized citizens in 1970.

Once they moved to Lynchburg, Anne took more interest in art and was encourage to paint by Bob Harmon, who she met volunteering at the Little Theater. She furthered her education by receiving a B.A. in Art and Sociology from Randolph-Macon Women's College in 1970, graduating with Magna Cum Laude. She completed some work for a masters at George Washington University.

Anne was passionate for helping young people develop creativity and was an instructor for Links Keyboard Center, Lynchburg Learning Center, and Lynchburg Community Action Group. Her work is inspired by her friends and her favorite medium is oil painting. She has exhibited at the Fine arts center, the Lodge of the Fisherman, Randolph-Macon Women's College, Vermont Avenue Gallery in Washington D.C., the Lynchburg Art Club, and Lynchburg Art Festival.

Bernhard Gutmann was born in Hamburg, Germany and immigrated to the United States at the age of 23 in 1892. In 1893 he became friends with Louis Jordan Smith, an art professor at Randolph-Macon Women's College. Together they formed the Lynchburg Art League in March of 1895, which later became known as the Lynchburg art Club.

He is known for his work as a graphic artist, teacher and his works including colorful landscapes, still lifes, genre scenes, and portraits. Bernhard taught classes at Lynchburg Public Schools and became the first supervisor of Art in Lynchburg Public Schools. He moved from Lynchburg to New York in 1899. In 1907 he married Bertha Goldman, whose grandfather was a founder of the Goldman-Sachs investment Firm. Together they traveled to France and Spain in their early years of marriage.

The financial security of marrying into a wealthy family allowed him to concentrate on his interest in art. Upon returning to the United States in 1913, he showed a painting at the Armory Show. Bernhard and his family moved to Connecticut and helped found the Silvermine Artists Guild. It wasn't until years after his death in New York that his descendants exhibited his work and he was "discovered" and referred to as an "American Gauguin."

Ray Parker Hamaker was the daughter of missionary parents who traveled to china to live as missionaries when she was three years old. Although it was unusual at the time, she went straight from K-12 school in China to College in the states.

She attended and received a B.A. and a certificate in music from Randolph-Macon Women's College. Ray taught biology at Randolph and later in Shanghai then returned to Lynchburg to marry her husband, Mr. Hamaker, the chairman at the biology department at Randolph.

She was on the School Board of Lynchburg and the Board of directors of the Lynchburg Art Club and was the president of the Lynchburg Women's Club from 1935-37. Ray was an organizer of the Lynchburg Historical Society, now the Lynchburg Historical Foundation Inc. in the 1930s. She was one of the first officers of the Virginia Art Alliance. Her book, *Foreign Devils* was published in 1969.

She was a member of the Poetry Workshop of the Women's Club, the Lynchburg Branch of the national League of American Pen Women, the Lynchburg Chapter of the Randolph-Macon women's College alumna Association, and the Lynchburg Branch of the American Association of University Women.

Patricia was married to Donald W. Harrington for sixty years and they had two sons together. They met while attending Central Michigan University during World War II.

He began an intensive study of early European and American art in 1973 and left commercial art to become a full-time painter.

Utagawa Hiroshige

1797 – 12 October 1858

Utagawa Hiroshige was born in Edo, Japan (now known as Tokyo), which became the capital of the Japanese Empire in 1603. Hiroshige is known as one of the last great masters of the Japanese color woodblock print.

He was fond of sketching from a young age. At the age of 12 both of his parents died and he took over his father's role as a fire warden. Around 1811, he was accepted as a pupil to Utagawa Toyohiro, who helped him form his style and find expression in the new genre of the landscape print.

He created figure prints, from 1811-1830. In 1818 he published his first work. Once his son took over as fire warden, he was able to devote himself to his art creating landscape prints from 1830-1844 and landscapes with figure prints from 1844- 1858. Throughout his life he traveled around Japan to gain inspiration and created more than 5,000 prints and more than 10,000 copies were made from his woodblocks.

Hiroshige was known for his unconventional colors and composition which influenced the Impressionist and Post-Impressionist painters in Europe. His tree and flower prints had a strong impression on Art Nouveau design. Vincent Van Gogh and Édouard Manet found inspiration from his unique and colorful work.

He created multiple series of prints including his ten-part series, the *Famous Views of the Eastern Capital* and the *53 Stations of the Takaidō* series completed in 1834. He was largely a self-taught artist and enjoyed to travel and experience new things. He passed away in the middle of the cholera epidemic.

Georgia Morgan joined the Lynchburg Art Club in the Mid-1920's after graduating from Randolph-Macon Women's College, where she studied under Bernhard Gutmann and Louise Jordan Smith. The Art Club had not found a permanent home or established formal membership rules until Georgia Morgan invited members to her studio in the fall of 1926. After that meeting, monthly exhibits of original work were displayed, and students' work was critiqued annually by an expert.

Miss Morgan became an art instructor at Lynchburg College, and eventually was named head of the Art Department from 1915-1945. She was active in the local art community and her works were also exhibited in Paris, London, and New York.

Miss Morgan was the first official President of the Lynchburg Art Club, an office she held from 1928-1932. That year, she helped establish the first Civic Art Show. We hold an exhibit every February to honor her dedication to the club and to the arts in our community.

She was elected to the National Association of Women Painters and Sculptures. She produced Miniatures and landscapes which she showed in galleries along the East Coast and the Paris Salon.

The sisters lived at 100 Columbia Avenue before retiring to Westminster - Canterbury. They were active members of the Lynchburg Art Club; each serving as president of the club. They also Enjoyed membership at Westminster Presbyterian Church, Hillside Garden Club, Lynchburg Historical Society, Antiquarian Club, Point of Honor and Restoration of the Academy Theater.

Their Paintings were exhibited throughout the state and won numerous awards. In April of 1967 they were honored with a joint exhibition of their work here at the Lynchburg Art Club.

They were direct descendants of Colonial Virginia Lieutenant Governor Alexander Spotswood 1710-1722 and by marriage related to the First Governor of an Independent Virginia, Patrick Henry.

In 1998 Virginia Governor, Jim Gilmore sent a helicopter to bring 104-year Mary to a party at the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts in Richmond. To her friends she was known as "Spot." Louise Jordan Smith was born in Warrenton, Virginia and died in Lynchburg, Virginia. In 1895 she and Bernhard Gutmann founded the Lynchburg Art League.

She studied in Paris for two years and in 1893 became Chairman of the Art Department at Randolph-Macon Women's College. She was the first art professor on the college's faculty, and it was she who instigated the purchase of *Men on the Docks* by George Bellows in 1920. This marked the foundation of the school's Maier Museum of art.

Her lectures were open to the women of Lynchburg. Her pupils included Georgia Weston Morgan, who became a prominent figure in Lynchburg's art community.
